Murrieta Valley Unified School District

Murrieta Valley Unified School District (MVUSD) is located in the southwest corner of Riverside County in close proximity to San Diego County. The district currently consists of 11 elementary schools, three middle schools, two comprehensive high schools, grades 9-12, an alternative high school and an independent study academy. The district employs approximately 1875 people and is the largest employer in the city of Murrieta. MVUSD has a student population of 21, 375 for the 2008-09 school year.

Murrieta Valley USD is a progressive, fast growing district. High test scores, creative programs, and tremendous parent involvement place Murrieta Valley Unified School District in the upper echelon of school districts. The District continues to be recognized with state and county honors for its exemplary programs, administrators, and teachers.

Murrieta Valley High School

Murrieta Valley High School (MVHS) is a modern, wellequipped public comprehensive high school with approximately 3108 students in grades 9 through 12. Campus and buildings include:

- 430 seat Performing Arts Center
- Modern library media center with over 35,000 books and non-print materials, also online library catalog and reference databases
- Internet connections available throughout the entire facility
- A 48.5 acre campus which includes a 4,000 seat lighted outdoor stadium and an 8-lane all-weather track
- A CIF regulation sized pool
- A 2,400 seat gymnasium
- NetTV in each classroom

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

MVHS offers Advanced Placement classes in Art History, U.S. History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry. English Language Composition, English Literature, European History, Government, Music Theory, Psychology, Physics B, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Statistics, and Studio Art. In 2007-2008, 501 students tested in 16 areas; 868 exams were attempted.

ACADEMIC/HONOR ORGANIZATIONS

Students may participate in academic and honor organizations such as Mock Trial, Academic Decathlon, California Scholastic Federation, National Honor Society, GATE, and the Advanced Placement Club. Students may also earn an "Academic Letter" for academic achievement and a pin for subsequent years.

ARTS AND ACTIVITIES

Over 20 specialty programs are offered at MVHS including music, dance, art, choir, student publications (The Talon and yearbook), student government (ASB, Student Senate), and theatre. There are also over 46 special interest clubs.

ATHLETICS

MVHS offers various interscholastic athletic programs at three competitive levels. MVHS is a member of the Southwestern League of the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF).

CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS

Our commitment at Murrieta Valley High School is to educate the total student. To do this, we offer strong academics and a variety of extra-curricular activities, club memberships, a strong athletic program and an outstanding performance and visual arts education. Our co-curricular programs play a substantial role in providing successful and meaningful educational experiences for students
