




SUPPLEMENTAL CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO THE GENERIC/BASIC NURSING PROGRAM AT CSU CHANNEL ISLANDS

Student applicants will be rank ordered for admission according to the following point structure. Up to 40 possible supplemental criteria points can be earned. Students must still meet the minimum percequisate course requirements for admission to be eligible for admission to the Centerio Basic Popram Points will be awarded based on coursework and volunteer/work experience hours completed at the time nursing application is archestrad.

Grade point average in Pre-Nursing Core course or equivalents: 10 Points Possible


