School Notes

Read with your child. It's the most important 20 minutes of your day.

Parents are critical partners in helping children learn to read. Yet sometimes parents just don't know how to encourage reading at home or how to make it fun and interesting.



Reading at home with your child is important in helping your child develop the skills necessary to become a successful reader, and it can also build relationships at the same time. Sitting close together and snuggling over a good book sends the message to your child that he or she is important to you and that you value time together. Sharing ideas about the story shows that you value your child's ideas and feelings. By making reading a special time, you increase the chances your child will see reading as an experience he or she doesn't want to miss.

Our 3^{rd} , 4^{th} and 5^{th} grade students have already taken the SRI (Scholastic Reading Inventory) assessment 3 times this year. After taking the SRI, students are given a Lexile that assists them in checking out books at the library in their reading range. This month, our 2^{nd} grade students will also be taking the SRI and will have a Lexile score. Please help your child choose appropriate books for reading by using their Lexile score when visiting the library. Go to <u>www.lexile.com</u> to learn more about the books in your child's Lexile range.

Positive Behavioral Supports Moment

What does it mean to be respectful? One meaning is to be careful not to do anything against someone's wishes or rights. This definition reminds a person of a very old saying called the golden rule which says, "One should treat others as one would like others to treat one self." Think of how positive our school might



look if we all took a moment to think of the kind of respect we would want others to treat us with.

Students be respectful of your parents' time by being attentive to the directions of Buchanan staff as they assist you to your parents' or guardian's car. Your parents will appreciate this as they pull forward and they can exit the loop in a timely manner.



On the playground students refer to one another in respectful terms. Comments during basketball or kickball games would be complementary rather than criticisms meant to hurt. When Buchanan staff has the need to redirect behavior, students look them in the eye, listen, and speak in a respectful tone. The student then takes the redirection to heart knowing that it is meant to keep them safe.

So many times being respectful means thinking about others first. In turn as we think of others first, more often than not, our outcomes are better. Think of the outcome if all those involved in Buchanan respected each other. The outcome would be a strong community with incredible character.


