Positive Behavioral Supports Moment

During this week of celebrating the life of Dr. Seuss we turn to his stories for advice on what it means to be safe. In the story "The Cat in the Hat" the fish in the pot screamed, "They should not fly kites in a house! They should not. Oh, the things they will bump! Oh, the things they will hit! Oh, I do not like it! Not one little bit!"





How does the fish in the pot relate to our Buchanan students and being safe? Well, the fish in the pot is similar to that little voice inside our head called our conscience. When we are observing a behavior or action that appears to be unsafe, that little voice will usually kick-in and tell us, "Wait just a minute that may not be the right thing to do. If I do that someone might get hurt. Oh, I do not like it. Not one little bit!" Often the key to being safe is listening to that voice inside our head. It can guide us to avoid dangerous situations, understanding right from wrong, or even helping someone else avoid being hurt. To borrow from another famous children's story character, "Let your conscience be your guide," and perhaps our students will watch the mischievous Cat in the Hat leave "with a tip of his hat" and think twice and always be safe.
