Happy Snowy New Year! We hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday break spending time with families and friends and the thrill of snow falling in Murrieta! As we begin the 2015 school year, we want to welcome any new families to our Buchanan community as well as welcome back our current families. We are excited about the upcoming semester and the wonderful events planned for the remainder of this year.

We will be offering a Parent workshop on Go Math and Think Central this month for all grade levels. Our first workshop will be Thursday, January 22, 2015 from 6:00 – 7:00 p. m. in our Library computer lab. This workshop will provide information on the changing math standards and resources available to support our math program. As always, during this time we will be experiencing days of inclement weather. With these wet and rainy days we need to remind parents about the proper procedures in our traffic loop area because we want to keep all of our Buchanan families safe. The red no parking curb from Sugarberry heading east to the school entrance is not to be used for student pick up or drop off. Please do not park or wait for children in this lane. Unfortunately, any parking or waiting could result in a ticket by MPD. Please stay in your car and proceed forward in the loop to pick up students at the curb. Please do not endanger students and/or adults by double parking in the open lane and having students pass through cars to load or unload, or make U turns on Torrey Pines Road. These maneuvers are illegal and slow the free flowing traffic lanes. Also, please do not leave cars unattended in the loop. Student should be in the front of the MPR waiting and watching for their ride and approaching the vehicle after is has come to a complete stop. Staff members are also on hand to assist students to their cars. If you do wish to park and the lot is full the city has provided more legal parking on both sides of Sugarberry Road.

#### **Revisiting Following Instructions**

Teachers and parents alike worry every summer about students losing some of the academic knowledge they gained from one year to the next as they take two months off from school. Well, in the winter, we as a staff worry that students will forget the school and classroom expectations they learned and followed while off for three weeks during winter break. Many teachers will take the time during January to reteach many of their classroom expectations just like they did way back in August. During January and February, as a school, Buchanan is going to do the very same thing.


In a recent poll of Buchanan teachers they stated that one of the most important school-wide expectations for students is following directions or instructions. I doubt this is a surprise to any Buchanan parent. How many times do you have to ask your son or daughter to take out the trash? I know when I was growing up that my parents would be furious as they reached time number 3 or 4 and I still had not taken out the trash, usually because I was distracted by the TV or a video game. Sound familiar? Or how about a task or a chore around the house that has to be done in a specific step by step way? Ever find that your son or daughter completed the literal form

of the request, but because the instructions were not followed specifically the task did not turn out quite right. In college my friends asked me to make some hash browns for breakfast. Now I followed the instructions as I saw them, but did not read them carefully enough. I poured a few teaspoons of oil in the pan, but instead of olive oil or vegetable oil, I decided to use corn syrup instead...good eh?

During the month of January we are going to revisit following directions. With his new cowboy hat, our friend Blazer Bob will meet with each grade level and review these steps to what it looks like to follow directions at school and in the classroom:

- 1. Make eye contact with the teacher or adult talking with you. This simple gesture can show anyone that you are paying attention.
- 2. Show you understand by saying "okay" or nodding your head. Letting a person know that you are following along with what they are saying is a great sign of respect.
- 3. Do what you have been asked right away. Teachers and other adults love to see a student not only listen, but show they understand by doing.
- 4. Check back after you are done. Let that person know you have followed the instruction and completed the task. They will love your follow through.

Happy New Year and welcome back for the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the 2014/15 school year to all of our Buchanan families and I hope that by working together your student will take out the trash the first time you ask.
