### -Bicycle and Scooter Reminders and Safety-

### Positive Behavioral Supports Moment

Bullying: Speak Up, Reach Out, and be a Friend

When we send out students off to school in the morning, one of the inherit givens we all want to have is that they will be safe. Safe as they ride their bike or scooter, safe as they play on the playground, and safe to learn life skills in their classrooms. One thing that can derail all of this is if they encounter another student or group of students that target them with bullying behavior.

At Buchanan we are attempting to teach social expectations that will equip our students to behave appropriately in several areas of their educational career. This month, as Buchanan students attend their social skills training they will be learning about bullying. The goal: to define bullying, describe the impact of bullying, and instruct on how to stop bullying. The hope, prevent bullying before it occurs.

It starts with defining bullying. Bullying is the **repeated**, **targeted**, and **intentional negative behavior** towards another person. There is a common misconception that when a student has a single experience where they are teased, hit, or threatened that they were being bullied. Now understand, teasing, hitting, or threatening are all incidents where a student will receive consequences for their behavior. They are potentially serious negative behaviors that need to be addressed as quickly as possible. However, a single incident is not bullying. It must be repeated over time. Additionally, students will also be exposed to the types of bullying from physical, to emotional, and also touch upon electronic or cyber bullying.

We also want to make sure students hear how bullying makes people feel, from both perspectives. First, there is the perspective of the victim and the isolation they feel along with the fact that extensive bullying can have a long lasting negative impact on their life. Secondly, why a bully becomes a bully? This includes a discussion about the fact that they may have an area in their life out of control or hurting them that cases them to use bullying to feel like they are in control of something.

Finally and the main purpose of our lesson about bullying, how can we make it stop. This is also a two pronged approach. Students need to understand how not to be a bully and what to do if they feel like they are being bullied. To do this we will have the students sign a pledge. The pledge's intent is for our students to be proactive, to not bottle emotion up until we feel alone or isolated. That pledge states:

- 1. SPEAK UP when I see bullying
- 2. REACH OUT to others who are bullied
- 3. BE A FRIEND whenever I see bullying

The Golden Rule:

Treat others the way You want to be treated.



### **State Assessments are Back for Grades 3-5**

After taking a year off from state assessments, we start again in spring of 2015. After spring break all Murrieta students grades three through five will be taking the first ever SBAC assessments in the subject areas of English Language Arts and Math.



Additionally, fifth graders will be taking a CST Science assessment.

### **Buchanan's Science Fair**



The Science Fair will be held during Open House on March 26th. Students in grades TK—3rd that are interested in participating in the Science Fair can get a packet of information from their teacher. An experiment science project is required of all 4th and 5th grade



students. 4th grade projects are due March 23rd and 5th grade projects are due March 20th. The top five projects from each 4th & 5th grade class will be entered into the Science fair.

February 13 Last day to submit RENEWAL AND NEW Inter-district Transfer requests during Open Enrollment.

**February 13** Last day to submit NEW Intra-district Transfer requests to school sites during Open Enrollment.

March 9 Online Enrollment for NEW elementary students -parents may begin to submit requested records to school sites to complete registration. See the school websites for more information.

June 12 Parents/guardians of Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten students will receive notification of placement at the home school and morning or afternoon session. The notification of determination on Intra-district and Inter-district transfer requests will be sent.

The 3rd reporting period report cards go home on March 27th.

### Helping at Home with Mathematics Homework

s a parent, you will want to help your children with homework—but you may not feel prepared to help with mathematics, especially as they get older and the mathematics becomes more complex. If that is the case, here is something you will be happy to learn: you do not have to be an expert in mathematics to help with mathematics homework!

Providing a well-lit table and comfortable chair is an important place to start. Remember, the best location for homework is not necessarily your son or daughter's bedroom. If your child studies at the kitchen or dining room table instead, you can help without having to sit down the entire time. You can assist when help is needed and still go about your own tasks. At the same time, you will have the opportunity to keep homework time focused by giving your child support, encouragement, and gentle reminders.

A good strategy is to pass by your child's work area and periodically "check in." A quick glance will often tell you if it is time to stop and provide some extra support. When it is clear that your child could use some assistance, take a deep breath and relax. If you stay calm, it will help your child stay calm.

Many parents worry about not knowing the mathematics their children are studying. In this case, the way to provide homework help is actually quite simple: ask questions and practice careful listening. Simple, generic questions can help your child gradually make sense of mathematics, build confidence, and encourage mathematical thinking and communication. When given the opportunity to talk about mathematics, children are often able to remember what they learned in class and see the solution themselves. A good question can open up your child's thinking about the problem at hand.

Here are some useful questions for parents to try. Remember that listening to your child's answers and providing calm responses are as important as the questions you pose.



When your child isn't sure how to begin a problem, ask:

- Can you tell me what you know now? What facts do you have?
- What do you need to find out? Can you estimate the answer?
- ☐ How might you begin? What can you try first?
- Can you make a drawing or picture to get started?

### While your child is working on a problem, ask:

- How can you organize your information? Will a list or table help?
- What would happen if . . . ? Show me what you did that did not work.
- Can you explain the strategy you are using to solve this? Why did you . . . ?
- What could you do next? Do you see any patterns?

#### When your child finds an answer, ask:

- Does that answer make sense? Why do you think that?
- How did you get your answer? Do you think it is right? Tell me more.
- Convince me that your solution makes sense. Explain it in a different way.

When questions alone just will not do, another strategy for helping your child is to identify a friend or relative who knows more mathematics than you do. Find out if that person would be willing to answer an occasional phone call from your son or daughter.
