Now is the Time to Enroll for Kindergarten in Fall

If your child will be 5 years old by Sept 1, 2015, now is the time to enroll them for Kindergarten for the Fall. Complete the online enrollment for your student at www.murrieta.k12.ca.us and once completed, bring the confirmation page with the required documents listed to the school office during the hours of 9:00-11:30am or 1:00-2:00pm to complete the enrollment. Classes are forming soon, so please enroll now. Computers are available in the school office if needed. If your child will be 5 years old between Sept 2, 2015 and Dec 2, 2015, then they are eligible to enroll in Transitional Kindergarten.

A Message from the Health Office

Health Alert-Food Allergies/Sensitivities

We have several students in our school that may have food allergies, food sensitivities or dietary restrictions. Food allergies can trigger reactions that range from very mild to life threatening (anaphylaxis). Generally, an individual must ingest a food allergen to have a reaction, but for some, even being exposed to it or ingesting a very small amount can cause a life threatening reaction. As a result, there are several procedures that will help to prevent exposure and reduce the risk of anaphylaxis and help keep all of our students safe:

- 1. Students should be encouraged to wash their hands upon arrival to the classroom and again before and after lunch. This not only is good for food allergies, but helps reduce disease transmission.
- 2. The classrooms should be peanut/tree nut/food allergy *aware* spaces. Classroom projects or assignments should NOT include the use of peanut butter/nuts or other food items. Any exception to this rule would require pre-approval and prior notification to parents.
- 3. Any food or snack that may be provided/shared must have pre-approval and prior notification must be provided to all parents prior so they can make alternate choices. Additionally, all food items provided should be pre-packaged and food ingredients must be known or labeled. Suggestions for class sharing (birthday parties, etc.) may be providing or donating a book for the classroom or other non-food items.

If your student has a food allergy, please make sure you contact/inform the Health Office. You may want to speak to the School Nurse if the allergy requires medication or other interventions. Students with food allergies may be entitled to accommodations or plans to address their needs. We look forward to working collaboratively with you to provide all of our students with a safe learning environment. We appreciate your care and support of our students and school.

Counselor's Corner and Positive Behavioral Supports Moment

Helpful Tips for Parents During Times of Loss



Loss in a family, whether it be from a death or divorce affect children in various ways. Some children may act out aggressively, while others become withdrawn. The following tips can help guide you through this difficult time.

- Let your child's teacher know that there has been a significant event in your child's life. If you are not comfortable sharing the details, of what has happened, it's okay to let the teacher know that the event is impacting your child a great deal. This will help the teacher understand differences in your child's work or behavior.
- **Get support for yourself**. As a grieving parent, it may at times, be difficult to remain strong. You may not know how to respond to your child's questions or behavior. Family counseling, individual counseling and support groups can provide helpful information and assistance during this challenging time.
- **Pay attention to changes in your child's behavior and seek help if necessary**. Although you may be occupied with adjusting to the new situation, it's important to watch for signs of distress in your child. You may see:
 - Changes in behavior, such as withdrawal or aggression Insomnia, bad dreams, or bed-wetting
 - Overeating or loss of appetite
 - Change in friendships, academics or interests
 - Self-harming behavior
- **Model appropriate coping behaviors.** Your child is looking at you to learn how to deal with sadness and loss. It is not necessary to hide your grief. Sharing sad feelings is realistic and helpful. However, modeling healthy strategies, such as exercising, eating healthy, and getting a good night sleep will be comforting to your child.
- Maintain the same routines as much as possible. If your child participates in extra-curricular activities, keep them going. Sleepovers with good friends and other play dates can remind your child that life can still be fun. These activities can be a welcome break from the sadness.
- **Do not overload your child with the "gory" details.** It is not necessary to share adult problems with your children. Although they may be inquisitive, it is important to set limits on what you share. Discussing your ex-spouse's inappropriate behavior with your child can be a tremendous burden. Financial changes can be explained with solutions instead of panic. For example, instead of saying, "I don't know how we are going to pay this high rent." you can say, "Because the rent for this house is very high, we will be moving to another house."
- **Reassure your child that although everyone is sad now, things will get better.** Discuss some of the fun things that are coming up in the future. Your child may feel confused when he has the ability to laugh and have fun during such a sad time, but fluctuating feelings are perfectly normal.
