

### Fifth Grade News

During the month of May, the 5<sup>th</sup> graders will have finished up the DARE lessons. Each student was assigned to write an essay explaining what he/she learned from DARE. Essays were turned in and Detective Therien will read the essays and select the top essay winner. This student will read his/her essay during DARE graduation. DARE graduation is May 13<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM in the BES amphitheater. Families are invited to attend. On May 12<sup>th</sup>, the students will have a panoramic picture taken by a local photographer. Pictures may be purchased on or

before May 12<sup>th</sup>. We will also be finishing up with the CAASPP testing towards the end of May. The students have worked extremely hard this year. We are proud of all of the effort and skills the group has mastered.

In June the students will continue to participate in Growth Mindset lessons as well as STEM activities so the students can collaborate on projects that will reinforce and challenge the grade level standards. At the end of each school year,  $5^{th}$  graders have the opportunity to participate in FUN WEEK. FUN WEEK is the last week of school. Students are earning honor points in order to participate in the field trips. The trips include swimming at California Oaks pool, roller-skating at Epic Rollertainment, watching a movie at Temeku, and a final awards assembly. Students earning Honor Roll and Physical Fitness Awards will be recognized during this assembly on the last day of school.

## Counselor's Corner

GOT Grit??? What it is, why it's important, and how to help your child get it.

Grit is defined as having perseverance and passion for long-term goals and working hard toward challenges, even when failure and adversity presents itself.

Grit is a "non-cognitive" skill, similar to self-control, resiliency, and curiosity.

Researchers now realize that grit is as important as academic skills!

We know that teaching literacy and math skills are important for a student's long-term success. But what happens when the math gets a little tricky? Or when the reading is "boring"? What keeps a student from giving up? **G R I T!** That's what!

AND. GRIT CAN BE TAUGHT.

# Here's how to help your child develop grit:

#### 1. Praise the effort, not the grade.

When you praise the "stick-to-it-ness" of your child's efforts, they will be more determined to continue working hard. Praising your child's hard work will encourage them not to give up.

#### 2. Let them struggle.

As hard as it is to see your child struggle, they need to learn how to work through frustration and failure. If you swoop in and save them before they fail, they will never learn how to deal with failure, which is a part of life. While they're struggling, praise their effort!

# 3. Create and talk about your own goals.

If your goal is to clean the basement, repaint the bedroom, or run that half-marathon, talk about it as a family. Share what small steps you are taking along the way to meet your goal, and talk about your own struggles and how you plan to get past them.

### 4. Keep and model an open mindset.

An open mindset is believing that things can change, that we can improve our skills and knowledge, and that we can get past challenges. Instead of saying, "I can't do this!" you can say, "I can't do this....yet."

# 5. Find ways to challenge your child.

Encourage your child to try new things, even if they aren't sure they're any good at it. Trying new things is how we learn from our mistakes. Give them age-appropriate chores at home. Find new hobbies and involve your child. Praise their effort along the way!

# School counseling in the classroom...

In April and May our second step classroom lessons for 3rd grade focus on being assertive to resist negative peer pressure. Students learn that it is okay to say no and that when someone says no to them, they needn't be upset. Accepting an assertive refusal is also a skill. Learning how to resist going along with peers can help students avoid a variety of problem behaviors. In 4th grade, the focus is on taking responsibility for one's actions. Students learn that this is the respectful thing to do, utilize problem solving steps when someone is wronged, demonstrate acknowledging mistakes, and making an apology or offering to make amends.





# Positive Behavioral Supports Moment – Finish Strong by Staying on Task

The 2015 and 16 school year is in its home stretch. State assessments are coming to an end and students are looking forward to end of year activities, so why should students stay on task?

The answer is one that can be borrowed from sports, finish strong! A strong finish will leave a lasting impression on those around you: teachers, parents, and other students. A great way to accomplish this is by showing you can see something to its end and stay on task. Like preparing for a race there are steps you can follow to stay on task.











Our Buchanan students are nearly to the finish. Those last few tasks need the same focus as those done all year. The best way to make sure you can attend, finish strong by staying on task!

- ⇒ Take earbuds out.
- ⇒ Do not text and walk, bicycle, skateboard or scooter
- ⇒ If you have a cellphone, call for help (911) if you feel threatened.
- ⇒ If you see someone bothering a friend call for help (911)


