

being heard encouraging their peers to do so even when challenges arise. Way to go, First Graders!


Second Grade News





The Blazer Way Moment Be Responsible: Following Rules

Rules, rules. They are on signs or posters, teachers repeat them, parents repeat them; they are everywhere. And, we expect students to follow them all, but have we ever considered to teach students how to follow rules. This month we focus on looking at individual situations and teach students how to apply rules to that situation. The following steps are a way to assess each situation for what rules to follow:

- 1. Stop and think about what rules apply to the current situation.
- 2. Adjust your behavior so that you are following those rules exactly.
- 3. Don't 'bend' or 'change' rules, not even a little.
- 4. If you have questions, find the appropriate adult to ask about the rules in question.

At the beginning of the school year we discussed what it means to Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe, and Follow KAHFOOTY. At Buchanan we call this the Blazer Way. We then

went out on to the playground and explicitly discussed the rules for the different activities students can play during recess. The hope, to provide simple terms that can provide rules students can apply to any situation. Disagree with another student on the playground, think about what it means to be respectful. Not turning in homework, think about what it means to be responsible. Sticking your foot out to trip another student, think about how this is unsafe and how it does not follow KAHFOOTY. Rather than thinking of rules as something that can restrict students, consider them as guidelines for how to assess life decisions.

Counselor's Corner

An Attitude of gratitude

A child's true happiness will never result from the accumulation of material things. What we so easily forget is that one of the key elements of true happiness is a sense of gratitude. It's one of the eight elements that research has revealed to be part of the lives of truly happy people. But how do we help our children develop a sense of gratitude?

Giving thanks is no longer just holiday fare. A field of research on gratitude in kids is emerging, and early findings indicate parents' instincts to elevate the topic are spot-on. Concrete benefits come to kids who literally count their blessings. Gratitude works like a muscle. Take time to recognize good fortune, and feelings of appreciation can increase.

Research shows that children who grow up receiving a never-ending stream of stuff are less grateful for what they have. In other words, *less is more*. While fewer presents for the holidays might trigger momentary disappointment, there's a very real likelihood that greater appreciation and thankfulness for what they have will be the long-term takeaway.

Some tips for promoting gratitude in your children's lives:

- Model gratitude for your kids by commenting frequently on the blessings in your own life.
- Create a mealtime ritual where each family member names one or two
 things that went well that day. Teaching children to focus on what's
 positive is one way to encourage an attitude of appreciation. Kids as
 young as three or four can be taught to participate in this.
- Gently denying your kids some of what they ask for is more likely to foster gratitude than giving them so much that they come to expect that life's bounty is limitless.
- Gratitude can develop when children engage in acts of loving kindness, like donating toys they no longer play with or clothing they no longer wear. It's an action that calls their attention to the ways they are blessed and fortunate. (Be sure they themselves carry the giveaway items into the homeless shelter or the hospital's pediatric ward.)

May this holiday season be a time that your children receive from you not just the stuff they see in stores, but the gratitude-building experiences that support a lifetime of authentic happiness.

School counseling in the classroom...

The elementary schools in our district utilize the Second Step program to provide monthly counseling lessons in grades 4 and 5. The Second Step program teaches children important skills for getting along with others and doing well in school. It also helps our school be a safe, respectful place where everyone can learn. To further help our school be a safe and respectful place, we are also going to use the Second Step Bullying Prevention Unit. In this unit, your child will learn specific skills to help stop bullying. Students will learn how to:

- Recognize when bullying is happening, report bullying to a caring adult, and refuse to let bullying happen
- Be a bystander who helps stop bullying
- Support someone being bullied by standing up for that person and being kind and inclusive
- Recognize, report, and refuse cyber bullying when they see or know about it happening

•	November 7	School Sites Accept <u>NEW</u> Intra-District Trans requests. *Intra-District = A transfer between schools in the MVUSD
•	January 3	District accepts <u>New</u> and <u>Renewal</u> Inter-District Transfers
•	February 1	Online Pre-enrollment begins for all students new to the Murrieta Valley Unified School District, including Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten students.
•	February 13	Final day of Open Enrollment for New or Renewal of <u>Inter</u> -District transfer requests.
•	February 13	Final day to submit <i>(NEW)</i> INTRADISTRICT transfer requests at the School Site.
•	March 6	Onsite enrollment appointments begin for Transitional Kindergarten, Kindergarten and New enrollees. Please contact the school site to make an appointment to complete registration and turn in documents <i>such as</i> , birth certificate/verification of age, immunization records, verification of residency and more depending on the grade level of your student.


