Prerequisite: Completion of Spanish 3 or Spanish 4 with a grade of A or B with recommendation by previous Spanish teacher

## AP Exam Requirement

Students attempting to receive college credit for Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses are required to pass a College Board exam which validates coursework. This exam is not a requirement for District High School credit, grade increases, or extra credit.

Student fees are allowable for Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate Diploma examinations for college credit, so long as (1) taking the exam is not a course requirement; (2) the exam results have no impact on a pupil's grade or credit in a course; and (3) eligible economically disadvantaged high school pupils who receive school district funding towards the exam fee shall pay $\$ 5.00$ of the fee. (EC sections 52240-52244; 52920-52922.)

## I. Goals

The student will:
A. Understand the equivalent of a third-year college course in Advanced Spanish writing and conversation
B. Utilize Spanish for active communication as evidenced by responding appropriately and quickly to oral questions in Spanish; summarizing orally the viewing of a Spanish language film; responding appropriately to questions based on a brief oral narrative; responding spontaneously to random questions posed in class; speaking extemporaneously on a given topic using appropriate vocabulary and accurate grammar
C. Utilize Spanish for active communication as evidenced by both initiating and participating in a conversation on an everyday topic area; improvising orally, based on a series of cues
D. Acquire vocabulary and grasp of structure that allows for the accurate reading and summarization of newspaper and magazine articles, as well as of modern literature in Spanish
E. Compose expository passages on a regular basis of at least 200 words on a given topic that will demonstrate organization, grammatical accuracy, extent and appropriateness of vocabulary and idioms, and general stylistic quality

## II. Outline of Content for Major Areas of Study

## Semester I

A. Apply advanced grammatical structures including verbs and verb tenses, adjectives, adverbs, prepositions, and pronouns, through context based activities, class textbooks and other materials
B. Expand vocabulary base and usage through lectures, readings and narratives
C. Analyze a variety of Hispanic Literature with emphasis on reading comprehension
D. Develop the writing ability to expand from the four to five paragraph essay format in Spanish
E. Develop the oral language proficiency by use of tape recorders, CD-Roms and presentations
F. Perform practice tests designed exclusively to prepare students for the AP Spanish Language exam

## Semester II

A. Apply advanced and demanding grammatical structures
B. Complete demanding formal writing activities
C. Perform extensive conversation practice and oral
D. Develop comprehension activities
E. Complete practice test sessions designed exclusively to prepare students for the AP Spanish Language
F. Conduct research on selected topics
G. Acquire practical Spanish communication skills for business, medical and other professions
