



What will Students Receive?

- Each student will receive a physical mailer and email from the CSU including:
 - Special early “direct admission” offer
 - A Cal State application coupon Code
 - Steps to enroll
 - Link their CaliforniaColleges account to Cal State Apply
 - Respond to remaining required questions (i.e. choice of major)
 - Submit at no cost with the coupon code



How will students be selected?

- RCOE will use CaliforniaColleges.edu platform to determine:
 - 12th grade students that are CSU eligible as of 11th grade and are enrolled in any needed 12th grade courses
 - 12th grade students who appear to be CSU eligible but not all data present
 - i.e. Dual enrollment courses



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Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCUs)

- Common Black College Application (CBCA)
 - \$20 Application Fee to Apply to all 56 Member Institutions



HBCUs are a source of accomplishment and great pride for the African American community as well as the entire nation. The Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, defines an HBCU as: “...any historically black college or university that was established prior to 1964, whose principal mission was, and is, the education of black Americans, and that is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency or association determined by the Secretary [of Education] to be a reliable authority as to the quality of training offered or is, according to such an agency or association, making reasonable progress toward accreditation.” - <https://sites.ed.gov/whhbcu/one-hundred-and-five-historically-black-colleges-and-universities/>



Types of Cal Grants

Cal Grants

Cal Grant A

For students with a Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least **3.0**, family income and assets below the state ceilings, and who demonstrate financial need

Cal Grant B

For students from disadvantaged or low income families with a GPA of at least **2.0**, family income and assets below the state ceilings, and who demonstrate financial need

Cal Grant C

For students from low income families pursuing **occupational, technical, and vocational** programs of study

Cal Kids Info

School-Aged Students

- Beginning in the 2021-2022 academic year, all eligible low-income 1st through 12th grade students identified by the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) enrolled on Fall Academic Census Day 2021 (October 6, 2021) in a California public school will have a CalKIDS account created in their name with an initial seed deposit, as well as the potential for additional financial incentives.
- Starting fall 2022 and each year following, all eligible low-income public school 1st grade students enrolled on Fall Academic Census Day (first Wednesday in October) will be identified by LCFF to receive funding from CalKIDS.
- Eligible students will be automatically enrolled in the program the following spring or early summer.

\$500

Every eligible low-income public school student in grades 1-12 will have a CalKIDS account created in their name with an initial deposit of \$500.

Plus \$500

Eligible students identified as **foster youth** will receive an **additional one-time \$500 deposit**.

Plus \$500

Eligible students identified as **homeless** will receive an **additional one-time \$500 deposit**.

That's up to \$1,500 in free money for college for school-aged students!


