- CalKIDS is a children's savings account (CSA) program administered by CA. CalKIDS will provide each child born in California and eligible low-income public-school students with up to \$1,500 in a CalKIDS account to help jumpstart their savings for higher education and career training!
- Eligibility:

Newborns: Born after July 1, 2022 \$25-\$100 School Aged: Low-Income Eligible, EL, Foster, Homeless (2021-2022) Oct 6th, 1st-12th grade \$500-\$1500

- <u>Register Account</u> @ <u>https://calkids.outcometracker.app/p/CalKids/calkids/registration/</u>
  Will need student <u>SSID</u> for registration, found in Aeries
- Link ScholarShare529
- Withdrawals can only be made by student to eligible institution
- Use of Funds funds can be used for Tuition, Books, Computer Equipment


