



Proposition 28: Arts and Music in School Funding Annual Report 2023-24 School Year

Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded:

During the 2023-24 school year, MVUSD began implementing Prop 28 arts education programs at the elementary level. School sites collaborated across the district to develop a model of itinerant VAPA teachers. This model allowed all schools and students (grades K-5) to have access to two different visual and/or performing arts learning experiences during the school year for nine-week sessions. Instructional classes included dance, visual arts, music, and drama. Materials and supplies were provided for the elementary VAPA teachers to enhance their instruction. This model will be enhanced for the 2024-25 school year with additional teachers (six to eleven positions), expansion to TK, and semester-long classes.

At the secondary level, school sites have not yet implemented new programs. This year has been an opportunity for sites to conduct needs assessments, identifying ways to enhance current programs and to provide new opportunities for student learning in the arts. Sites are finalizing their plans for implementation during the 2024-25 school year. Secondary schools utilized Prop 28 funding this year to purchase supplementary materials and resources for use within the current VAPA programs. This included a variety of supports, including guest artists, sound system upgrades, visual art supplies, equipment, and training, all of which enhanced their current programs.
