






Elementary Summer School



High School = 699 Students


Summer Bridge = 350 Students

 - > 23,268







BLENDED

Models are delivered based on <u>current</u> State and County public health conditions. These may change based upon any NEW public health mandates or orders given to schools after 7/17.

We must be prepared for all three models and remain nimble!

Virtual Model Details

Elementary & Secondary Instruction

Learning Schedule

- **Elementary**
 - ✓ Daily Structured Academics/Live Instruction from 8 am − 12 pm
 - ✓ Daily Intervention/Extension Activities in the afternoon
- **Secondary**
 - ✓ Mon-Fri based on Student Schedule

Learning Activities

- ❖ Daily meeting or check-in with teacher
- Live interaction with teacher and peers, small group sessions, progress monitoring, and maintaining school connectedness using Microsoft Teams & Canvas
- Screencasts and videos to deliver pre-recorded instruction (allows flexibility for families)
- Independent work including online programs, project-based learning, inquiry and application of skills

Virtual Model

Virtual instruction is NOT distance enrichment that took place in the Spring.

- Daily attendance required
- Graded learning and assessments
- Emphasis on *live instruction* and teacher-student connection
- > In-person individualized instruction, services, and assessments
- > Office hours availability (in-person or virtual)
- ➤ **NEW** Learning Management System *Canvas*
- Device and connectivity required
- Student and family training provided
- Signed parent agreement
- Based on enrollment, students may be assigned to a teacher at a different school

Students with Disabilities

All grade levels

- ☑ *IEPs will address learning models and* progress will be monitored
- ☑ Class schedules will mirror general education with exceptions applied to special cases
- ☑ Related services will be provided virtually and in-person
- ☑ Creative solutions for inclusive, instructional aide, and other specialized supports
- ☑ Access to assistive technology
- ☑ Training for families to support student learning



Blended Model Logistics for all grade levels

Elementary Instruction

Secondary Instruction

- Students on-site 2 days
- ➤ (Tues/Thurs or Wed/Fri)
- Learning from home 3 days per week
- Class size will be ½ of traditional class size
- On campus days will dismiss early (lunch at home)

- Combination of classes on campus and others virtually*
- On campus class sizes will be traditional
- Number of on campus classes will determine length of school day*

*Based on course selections

Blended Model

Elementary & Secondary Instruction

- Daily attendance required
- > Graded learning and assessments
- Emphasis on *live instruction* and teacher-student connection
- > In-person individualized instruction, services, and assessments
- Office hours availability (in-person or virtual)
- NEW Learning Management System Canvas
- > Device and connectivity required
- Student and family training provided
- Signed parent agreement
- Based on enrollment, students may be assigned to a teacher at a different school

Traditional Model

Elementary & Secondary Instruction

- > 5 days per week for a full day of in-person instruction
- Traditional class sizes
- > School schedules remain the same
- > Traditional grading and progress reporting
- Individual use of supplies and materials
- ➤ NEW Learning Management System Canvas
- Outside visitors and parent volunteer opportunities will be limited.



Co-Curriculars

- ✓ All co-curriculars and athletics must adhere to CDPH, CDE and CIF.
- ✓ Field Trips are not permitted at this time. Teams may consider virtual field trips.
- ✓ Large gatherings are not permitted at this time due to public health restriction. For example, assemblies, dances and rallies.
- ✓ Specialized elective courses will continue to be offered (i.e., performing arts, band, choir etc...)
- ✓ Elementary visual and performing arts programs will continue to be offered.
 - Method of delivery is subject to change based on CDPH.

Cleaning & Disinfecting


▲ Thorough and detailed deep cleaning & disinfecting of every part of all schools prior to students returning

▲ Nightly enhanced cleaning & disinfecting at all schools including all desks and high touch surfaces

▲ Cleaning & disinfecting of frequently touched surfaces during the day

▲ Installation of hundreds of additional hand sanitizers throughout all schools including all classrooms & high traffic areas

▲ Placement of portable hand wash stations at all schools



Hand Sanitizer Installs

At all Schools-Placed in classrooms, offices, hallways, entry points & exits, high traffic areas









Portable Hand Washing Stations

- ✓ Placed throughout school sites.
- Supplemental to fixed bathroom & sinks
- ✓ Operated by feet, no need to touch with hands.









HVAC/Air Conditioning

✓ All HVAC systems checked, cleaned, maintained and all filters changed

✓ Reviewed recommendations from the National Air Filtration
Association

✓ All HVAC systems will have fresh, uncirculated air into classrooms based on industry recommendations from the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning (ASHRAE)

Classroom Changes

Sample Secondary Class

- Removal of furniture to allow more space to physically distance students
- Set up of student desks to be as physically distanced as possible
- > Hand sanitizer in all classrooms
- Protective shields at the teacher's desk
- ➤ Masks available in classrooms
- Disinfectant in all classrooms for high touch areas
- Special disinfectant in all classrooms that is safe for electronics and computers



PPE for teachers, staff and students

Per CA Statewide mandate, face coverings are currently required in public spaces. This may change as conditions change.




Technology

- ✓ Major expansion of outdoor wireless access points in anticipation of increased use of outdoor spaces
- ✓ Installed a new Bell & Paging system at 17school sites—
 - ✓ New system offers significantly improved messaging capacities, dynamic control of scheduling, per class zones, and many other communication tools including ability to play regularly pre-recorded messages on handwashing and safety



Nutrition Services











Elementary lunch by class; Class picture will display on point of sale screen allowing staff to simply select students' picture for payment.

Nutrition Services





- ✓ Social distancing signage and floor adhesives will be used in service areas
- ✓ Window services will be limited to every other window to allow distance between lines
- ✓ No self-service stations such as salad bars, condiments and share baskets.
- ✓ All personnel will wear PPE during food prep and service
- ✓ Hand sanitizers will be available in all service areas.
- Enhanced cleaning/sanitizing measures will be implemented in lunch areas
- ✓ Foods will all be served packaged & pre-packaged
- ✓ Points of sale will be contact free for students
- ✓ Elementary students will receive a backpack tag to use for breakfast or to go meal pick up.

Transportation

- ✓ Limiting amount of students per seat.
- ✓ Sanitizing buses after each route. Additional time built into the schedule to ensure sanitation during the day.
- ✓ Installing hand sanitizers & encouraging use while entering and exiting the bus
- ✓ Providing PPE including masks and shields for bus riders and staff
- ✓ Signage to remind about safety, distance and best practices
- ✓ Additional staff to cover larger bus stops
- ✓ Pre-registration for Transportation riders

Review of Classroom layouts and design plans
