The safety of our students, staff and school sites is a top priority. We partner with city law enforcement in several ways. Collaboratively, we fund School Resource Officers at the schools, implement prevention services, programming, and partake in joint trainings and meetings. Additionally, our local first responders help to improve our incident response and emergency protocols. The color will change based on this year's performance and change (positive or negative) from the previous year.
