

A VISION... A DREAM...

In 1980, Mary Catherine Swanson created the AVID program in San Diego as an answer to the problem enrolling under-served students in post-secondary education and reaching students inthe middle. Beginning with one high school and 32 students, the program now serves over 700,000 students inmore than 4,900 schools in 46 states and 16 countries. The AVID Program has graduated thousands of students and matriculated them to college at over a95 percent rate. Nationally, over 89 percent of AVID graduates go directly to afour-year college, which is significant compared to the 34 percent for non-AVID students.

WHAT IS AVID?

AVID, or Advancement Via Individual Determination, is an academic program designed to increase school-wide learning and performance. The target AVID student is astudent who has astrong desire to attend a four-year university and may or may not have an engraved foundation for success. AVID students are bright students who may be underachieving, or they are first-generation college bound students who could benefit from additional guidance and support of ahighly structured program. The AVID elective is aclass that provides social and academic support as well as academic monitoring and tutoring. The class focuses on reading and writing skills, organizational skills, Socratic questioning skills and collaborative learning skills. Students have access to college-age tutors and take part intest preparation lessons to increase their performance inrigorous classes as well as standardized exams, such as the SAT and ACT.
