#### **Q: Who is my Counselor? Based on your Last Name**

#### **Q: When are counselors available to meet with parents and students?**

A: Please go to our Counseling Website to schedule a Virtual Meeting with your counselor

A: Counselors are available for PARENTS 10-11:30 AM

A: Counselors are available for STUDENTS 12:30-3:30

#### **Q: When are schedule changes allowed?**

A: During the first 10 days of the start of the semester, students may complete a Schedule Change Request Form. Counselors will review the request and make changes if available.

#### **Q: Where do I check my grades?**

A: There are 2 places grades are posted, on Canvas and Aeries. Aeries will be updated at the minimum at the 6 week Progress Report, 12 week Progress Report, and Final Grades. Log into your Aeries Portal account to check you grades weekly, especially at the 6 week, 12 week and Final Grades. All students have an Aeries, Canvas, and Microsoft 365 accounts with their [studentID@mvusd.org](mailto:studentID@mvusd.org).

#### **Q: What should I do if I am struggling in a class?**

A: The first thing you should do is to TALK TO YOUR TEACHER. GO TO OFFICE HOURS!!!

#### **Q: How are credits awarded?**

A: 5 credits are awarded per class with a passing grade (D or better).

#### **Q: What is the difference between “non-weighted” and “weighted” GPA?**

A: Each grade has a point value A=4 points, B= 3 points, C= 2 points, D= 1 point, and F = 0 point.

AP (Advanced Placement) and IB (International Baccalaureate) classes receive an extra point which bumps the value for A=5 points, B=4 points, C=3 points but a D and F remain same as non-weighted value.

#### **Q: What are A-G College Entrance Requirements and how are they different from Graduation Requirements?**

A: A-G College Entrance Requirements are specific subject area that College and University review on Transcripts to determine eligibility. Information is available on our Course Catalogue.

#### **Q: How do I order transcripts?**

A: We use Parchment for Transcripts

#### **Q: How do I get a Work Permit?**

A: Work permit forms are available on our Counseling Website listed under Counseling Forms.

You must first get a job, then complete the 3 top sections, then email or scan it to Mrs. Young.

**Q: What are the Graduation Requirements?**

A: Total of 230 Credits

Elective=50 credits

English=40 credits

History=30 credits (Modern World History, US History, and Government/Economics)

Math =30 credits

Physical Education=20 credits

Science=30 credits (Life Science, Physical Science and one additional)

Visual and Performing Art=10 credits

World Language=10 credits

Health/Career=10 credits

A: For 2020-2021 school year the 40 total hours of community service have been waived
