ABOUT MVUSD

Murrieta Valley Unified schools offer an excellent academic program with award-winning student activities, performing arts and outstanding interscholastic athletic programs. The student-centered educational program emphasizes a standards-based curriculum and a commitment to the academic success of every student. MVUSD has a student population of approximately 23,527 students which includes a number of Chinese students who are here through a partnership between MVUSD and the Tower Bridge International Education Company. Currently Murrieta Valley High School has 9 of these students.

MURRIETA VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL

Murrieta Valley High School (MVHS), a California Distinguished School, is a four-year comprehensive high school fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Recently renovated, the 55 acre campus provides an inviting learning environment for 2,312 students in grades 9-12. Campus facilities include:

- MSJC College Annex Program
- A 430 seat Performing Arts Center
- A 4,000 seat lighted outdoor stadium and 8-lane, all-weather track
- A CIF regulation-sized swimming pool
- 10 classroom-sized computer labs
- 30 classroom-size portable computer labs
- A library/media center with 100 computer stations
- A 2,000 seat gymnasium

SPORTS DATA

MVHS offers 23 Boys and Girls Varsity Athletic Teams - 52 total teams, including lower levels. MVHS has won several CIF championships and numerous Southwestern League Titles. MVHS has twice won the CIF Southern Section Champions of Character Award and the Southern Section School Sportsmanship Award.

LEADERSHIP

Our commitment at Murrieta Valley High School is to educate the total student. To that end, we offer strong academics and a wide variety of cocurricular activities. Our Leadership Program is particularly note-worthy. The Student Council at MVHS has earned the Outstanding Student Activities Program Award from the California Association of Directors of Activities (CADA) and the California Association of Student Leaders (CASL) for 20 consecutive years! Additionally, National Association of Student Councils (NASC) has recognized the Student Council in its Gold Council of Excellent multiple times.

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

MVHS has a rich tradition of Visual and Performing Arts. We boast active vocal music and competitive marching band programs, as well as visual and performing arts, drama, photography and dance.

IB DIPLOMA DATA

The IB Diploma Programme was instituted at MVHS in Fall 2010 to provide students with enhanced learning opportunities to better prepare them for success in their futures both academically and professionally in a global society. In May 2019, 85% of the Diploma candidates earned their diploma with an average score of 30. Over the last three years, 84% have scored 4 or better across the 16 IB courses offered at MVHS. Students are allowed to take up to 4 HL courses of the 8 currently offered: English-Literature, History of the Americas, Psychology, Biology, Physics, Math, Spanish B and French B. Last year, 64 students took a total of 163 IB assessments. 20 students earned their IB Diploma in 2019. There are 40 Diploma candidates in the class of 2020, and 55 in the class of 2021.

AP DATA

MVHS students have demonstrated success in Advanced Placement classes for the past twenty-two years, and has a 40% participation rate in AP coursework and exams. Fifteen courses are currently offered including: Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English Language, English Literature, European History, Physics I, Psychology, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Statistics, Human Geography, US Government and US History. In 2019, 461 students took 775 AP exams. Of those scores, 59% were a 3 or better. In 2020, 441 students took 683 exams during the pandemic conditions. Of those scores, 63% were a 3 or above.

COLLEGE ENROLLMENT AND POST-SECONDARY PLANS

The Class of 2017 had 72% of its graduates enroll in higher education the fall of 2017. Of these, 38% attended four-year universities and 34% attended 2-year institutions. Class surveys revealed that 1% planned to attend a trade or technical school, 5% of the students planned to enlist in the military. Another 5% planned to work, and the remaining were undecided. In 2018, 74% of graduates continued with higher education immediately; 44% to a 4-year university and 30% at a 2-year college. The class of 2019 yielded 72% immediate enrollment, with an equivalent balance between 4-year and 2-year institutional choices, 36% for each.
