Elks National Foundation Programs

2020-21 Most Valuable Student Scholarships:

- Open to any high school senior who is a citizen of the United States. Applicants need not be related to a member of the Elks. Must be seeking a 4-yr. college degree.
 - Applications available beginning August 5, 2020, on the website.
 www.elks.org/enf/scholars/mvs.cfm Deadline for entry Nov. 15, 2020,
 - Be sure to review the MVS "Frequently Asked Questions" to familiarize yourself with the requirements and applying instructions.
 - The ACT or SAT has been waived this year due to Covid-19.
 - You MUST answer the application questions precisely as asked, you are judged and ability to follow directions.
- Winners from the Lodge advance to District, District to State and State to National level competition.
- National level: There are 500 four-year scholarships, ranging from \$1000 per year to \$12,500 per year at National level. Examples are: Two first-place awards of \$50,000; two second-place awards of \$40,000; and two third-place awards of \$30,000. Fourteen will receive awards of \$20,000. The remaining 480 receive \$4,000.
- · All level judging is based on the following criteria.
 - Financial need, leadership, academic achievement and record, and community involvement.
- The completed application must be entered online on or before November 15, 2020.

Keep in mind that it does not matter where the student goes to school; it only matters where the student lives.

Vocational Grant:

<u>California-Hawaii Elks Association Program</u> The program is open to anyone residing in California or Hawaii, who is a citizen of the United States of America and planning to pursue an eligible vocational/technical course resulting in a certificate or two-year degree and leading to employment opportunities. The program is open to male and

female applicants who will be judged on an equal basis. While graduating high school seniors may apply, it is not limited to high school students – in fact, it is open to all prospective students who require training or retraining to compete in the workplace.

- The Vocational Grant is for one academic year, with an option to renew for one additional year. This grant may be used only for usual and required costs of student's course of study; that is, for tuition and fees, room and board (if living on campus) and books & supplies. Payment will be made to the school. Awards will be between \$500 and \$2,000 for an academic year depending on length of course. Students planning to transfer to a four-year school to pursue a Bachelor's Degree are not eligible to apply.

- Winners from the Lodge advance to District, District to State and State to National level competition.
- National level: There are 500 four-year scholarships, ranging from \$1000 per year to \$12,500 per year at National level. Examples are: Two first-place awards of \$50,000; two second-place awards of \$40,000; and two third-place awards of \$30,000. Fourteen will receive awards of \$20,000. The remaining 480 receive \$4,000.
- · All level judging is based on the following criteria.
 - Financial need, leadership, academic achievement and record, and community involvement.
- The completed application must be entered online on or before November 15, 2020.

Vocational Grant:

<u>California-Hawaii Elks Association Program</u> The program is open to anyone residing in California or Hawaii, who is a citizen of the United States of America and planning to pursue an eligible vocational/technical course resulting in a certificate or two-year degree and leading to employment opportunities. The program is open to male and

female applicants who will be judged on an equal basis. While graduating high school seniors may apply, it is not limited to high school students — in fact, it is open to all prospective students who require training or retraining to compete in the workplace.

- The Vocational Grant is for one academic year, with an option to renew for one additional year. This grant may be used only for usual and required costs of student's course of study; that is, for tuition and fees, room and board (if living on campus) and books & supplies. Payment will be made to the school. Awards will be between \$500 and \$2,000 for an academic year depending on length of course. Students planning to transfer to a four-year school to pursue a Bachelor's Degree are not eligible to apply.
