1. Course Description

This is a one year college prep course. This course will explore real world problems, develop strategies for problem solving, integrate related topics and other disciplines, develop concepts through the use of technology, provide opportunities to communicate mathematically and provide on-going review and self evaluation.

2. Attendance

If a student is absent, he/she must clear within 2 days of returning to class in order to obtain missed work. Student is responsible for any missed work.

3. Tardies

Students must be in the room ready to work when the tardy bell rings. Tardies will be enforced according to the schoolwide tardy policy listed in the student handbook.

4. Grading Policy

Percentages will be based on a running total of all points throughout the semester in each category. Students are responsible to keep a log of grades and assignments in their notebook.

5. Required Materials

Students are required to have pen/pencil, paper, scientific calculator.

6. Assignment expectations

Classwork will be due at the end of the period. Homework will be due at the beginning of the next class period. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to complete all missed assignments. Each student needs to take complete responsibility of his/her work. You are responsible for checking that all your work is done correctly by checking your answers to odd problems in the back of the book. Answers to even problems are available by looking in the teacher's edition book. **Late work is not accepted.**

7. Class Expectations

- a) Do not bring food, drinks, gum, candy, etc. into the classroom at any time.
- b) I will strive to treat each of you with the utmost respect and I will demand the same from you. Furthermore, you will treat your fellow classmates with the same respect.
- c) You will be responsible to maintain the cleanliness of the classroom at all times. The class will not be dismissed until the classroom is clean.
- d) Do not bring materials out in class that disrupt the learning environment such as electronic devices or other materials not pertaining to our class. These materials will be confiscated and turned in to the administrative office if they are brought out in class.
- e) If you do not plan on working hard and putting forth the effort to learn and succeed, this is not the class for you. I will accept nothing less than 100% effort each and every day. You are responsible for your grade... no one else!

8. Academic Integrity

All assignments are individual assignments unless they are specifically called group assignments. Though I encourage you to help and discuss material with each other, there is a difference between this and simply exchanging answers verbally or in written form. Assignments are worth points, your name is on the paper, and it should represent your understanding of the material and your effort - not someone else's. Students who copy work tend to do poorly in the class overall. Most of the time it takes two to cheat; I will not distinguish between the giver and the receiver of information. The penalty for cheating will be the same for both students involved, zero on assignment.
