IB Diploma Costs

Fees are due November of each testing year.

Subject fee (subject to change)

- \$122 per subject test
- Free/Reduced lunch: only \$9 fee per exam
- No fee is charged for TOK or EE for DP

<u>Total cost for DP</u>: 6 tests at \$122 = \$732 or \$54 if on Free/Reduced lunch (potentially earning 30+ college credits)

Application Process

- In 10th grade, complete the IB registration packet (2-yr plan, honor code, contract)
- Submit registration packets to Mrs. Thornburg in early February.
- If accepted, student will meet with counselor and coordinator to develop/confirm a personalized two-year plan.

IB Leadership Team

All IB teachers at MVHS have attended multi-day trainings in the specific courses they teach. Grade level counselors will advise on IB schedules.
