Summer Classes Start July 1



- Students do NOT have to withdraw from their school of residence.
- Students can take one course at a time and can earn up to 10 credits (depending upon the number of weeks available during the student's summer break). Students can take 1 semester course every 10 school days.

#### **Steps to Enroll:**

- 1. Speak with your counselor to determine the necessary courses.
- 2. Determine if online learning is for you.
  - a. Do you have access to a computer? The program does not work on a cell phone or tablet.
  - b. Do you have access to internet?
  - c. Are you willing to spend more than 4 hours per day to complete schoolwork? In traditional school, you spend about 60 hours in class for a single semester course. Our coursework requires a similar time requirement.
  - d. Are you taking summer classes at your school or with another program? If so, you cannot enroll with Mission Academy. No dual enrollment.

#### **MVUSD School Board Policy**

Murrieta Valley USD has an updated Board Policy that will go into effect Summer 2017. The portion of the BP that relates to Diego Hills Central is the following. This policy directly relates to Alternative Credits and states the following: "MVUSD only accepts 40 outside credits, 10 credits per year. Current high school students may take courses to recover credits and accelerate in the areas of visual and performing arts, second year of physical education and electives. Incoming 9th grade students may take a visual performing arts course that is UC approved to accelerate."

Seniors who are planning to graduate in June **must** submit this *Alternative Credits Permission Form* to their counselor for course approval by **April 15.** If a course needed for graduation is initiated after **April 15**, the credits will not be accepted.

Official Transcripts for Seniors planning on graduating in June are due to the Guidance Tech's office no later than May 31st. (Note: On average it takes most institutions at least two weeks processing time for official transcripts.)

Students MAY NOT enroll in a course during the last 15 days of the grading period/semester.

**NOTE**: This form is applicable to courses taken outside of the MVUSD. MVUSD only accepts 40 outside credits, 10 credits per year. Current high school students may take courses to recover credits. In addition, current high school students may accelerate in the areas of visual and performing arts, second year of physical education and electives. Incoming 9th grade students may take a visual performing arts course that is UC approved to accelerate. Students MUST be simultaneously enrolled in classes at MVUSD schools while attending an off-campus class. You may NOT do part-time schedules at MVUSD schools and part-time at off campus locations. Students must attend MVUSD schools for a minimum of five district classes.

**WARNING**: The off campus course you have requested as a graduation requirement for MVUSD MAY NOT be accepted by the UC/CSU system, private colleges, universities, out of state institutions, or NCAA as fulfilling entrance requirements. Be sure to check with an admissions officer from each campus to which you intend to apply.

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
