

- PSAT cancellation Fall 2020
- SAT stay tuned for possible testing sites that will be open in the Spring
- Protect your GPA! Keep it as high as possible!

- Take advantage of your CCGI account for career exploration at www.californiacolleges.edu
- CCGI Junior Milestone is to update your college list
