- Community Service Hours Waived, *service cord can be earned if student completed 150+ hours

 - Social Science (Mod World, US, Gov/Econ) 30 credits


+ 2 Year/4 Year Colleges



- 2 Year Colleges
 - Applications begin in the Spring of senior year
 - Many students attend to receive their AA degree and transfer to a 4-year
- 4 Year Colleges
 - Receive a bachelor's degree
 - Must meet A-G requirements
 - College Admissions Testing SAT/ACT, visit the school's websites to know their entrance requirements and if an assessment will be needed

Make Senior Year Count!

- English & Math! Being successful in your English & Math courses will have many benefits.
 - May be used for placement purposes. Check with individual campuses
 - Success in 1st year, freshman year
- Grades matter!
 - Colleges can rescind acceptances if student receives D or F's
 - Some military branches may reference GPA
 - Some jobs will look at your transcripts
- Continue with your rigorous courses
- Colleges request final transcripts to ensure you kept your grades up and didn't drop challenging classes
- Get involved!
- Speak to your counselor if you are unsure about your after high school plans so you feel confident after graduation

Make Senior Year Count

- Access writing lab, math lab, ask for help New!
- All Subject Tutoring available Oct 4th information can be found in most recent newsletters
- Identify which classes you must pass for graduation
- College applications get organized!
 - Know your college application deadlines
 - Research what supplemental information your college requires (i.e. letters of recommendation, essay, etc.)

- Requirements are: To meet minimum admission requirements, you must complete 15 year long high school A-G courses with a letter grade of C or better — at least 11 of them prior to your last year of high school.
- 2.5minimum GPA requirement

Recommendation Letters



- Formally ask (via email) your teacher or counselor to write you a letter of recommendation
- Provide your recommender with a <u>Brag Sheet</u>, found in the Counseling Canvas under Counseling Forms
- If you have a resume, include it with your brag sheet
- Ask at least two weeks in advance
- Provide your recommender with your application due date
- Send them a Thank You email/letter for their time!



+ How to read your transcript:



- SSID = State ID (10 digit)
- Credits earned
- GPA weighted non weighted
- Class rank
- What does the "P" mean?
- What does the "+" mean?
- Legend "Course Tags"

Course Tags: * = Non Academic

+ = Honors (weighted)

p = College Prep

r = Repeated

NCAA

- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved courses
- NCAA Eligibility Center has waived the ACT and SAT for eligibility requirements for the Class of 2022
- At the end of the year, students should ask their counselor to upload official transcripts to the NCAA eligibility Center. If you took classes at more than one high school or program, ask each to submit an official transcript



FAFSA – Federal Aid

- Launch your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) from your student's California Colleges account
- FAFSA window to apply is Oct. 1, 2021 March 2, 2022
 - Step 1: Student/Parent need an FSA ID
 - Step 2: Gather the following documents Social security #, Driver's License #, federal tax returns (2020), Cash, savings, and checking account balances. Details about investments, like stocks, bonds, business or farm assets, or real estate (except the home you live in). Records of some untaxed income, including child support, interest income (also known as dividends), and veterans noneducation benefits.
 - Step 3: Apply for FAFSA on Oct 1st!
- Oct 4th 6th, FAFSA Blitz Presentations in Gov't/Econ class (presented by counselors)
- Please stay tuned for parent workshops for assistance and FAFSA incentives!



Cal Grant / State Aid

- How to Apply
 - 1. Submit <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>California Dream Act Application</u>
 - 2. VMHS will electronically send Cal Grant GPA to the CSAC
 - 3. After submitting your FAFSA or CADAA, Create an Account at WebGrants4Students to check the status of your Cal Grant
