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This course meets UC/CSU (E) and district graduation requirements. Students will learn about the language and culture of Spanish-Speaking countries. Beginning - level skills in listening, reading, writing and speaking will be developed through a variety of instructional activities. Emphasis will be placed on spoken communication in the target language on a regular basis to enhance student's linguistic abilities.

Materials:

En Español, Year 1 Textbook . This is to be checked out from the library and kept at home. There is a set of books in the classroom to use during class.

Students will need to download the homework packet per chapter. We will use it everyday!

Flashcards are available online using Quizlet. They are organized per chapter and per chapter quiz, students can find the link using Canvas (our new learning management system- not Haiku.)

Homework:

Vocabulary is assigned daily from the Unit (Module). Students should study the vocabulary and listen to and perfect pronunciation with Quizlet and the use the Quizizz link to take the Quiz in class. If students do not like their scores they are free to try again by re-taking the vocabulary Quizizz because after all practice is a good thing.

We will do daily work in the packet. If you do not download the packet, an alternative is to write out the assignments and keep them in your binders in a designated section for Spanish.

Tests:

Tests will be given at the end of each Chapter. Chapter Tests and the FINAL are cumulative.

Absences:

If you are absent from class, try to catch up with us as quick as you can. All lessons are done with you online and I do not deviate from the content. If you are absent from the test, schedule a make up test.

Classroom Rules:
