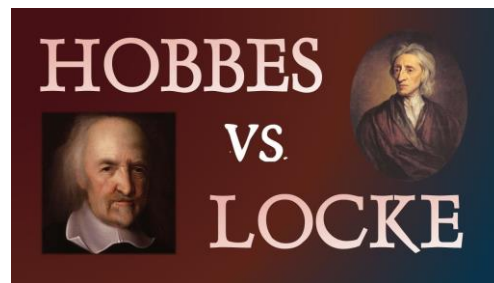


# AP European History



- Study the cultural, economic, political, and social developments that have shaped Europe from c. 1450 to the present. You'll analyze texts, visual sources, and other historical evidence and write essays expressing historical arguments.
- We will focus particularly on social and political history with special emphasis on gender roles and daily life.
- Will have open discussions about European history and its effect on modern society.
- Will explore European history through the amazing artists of the time.
- This course is an elective course for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students.
