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ACKNOWLEDGMENTS:

- **1. Rules & Regulations:** All high school students are responsible for complying with the rules and regulations of the college as published in the MSJC catalog.
- **2. Document Submission:** A completed School/Parent Agreement form and current high school transcripts are required each term while enrolled in high school. Documents are to be submitted to the Enrollment Services HUB before the stated deadline. https://www.msjc.edu/enroll/documents/How-to-submit-documents.pdf
- **3. Eligibility:** High school students are admitted to this program based on previous courses work, recommendations from the high school counselor and must satisfy all pre-requisites/eligible requirements for each course.
- **4. Pre-Requisite Requirements:** When a course has a pre-requisite requirement, it means that a student must demonstrate pre-existing knowledge and/or skills to be successful in the course by completing the required previous course(s). https://catalog.msjc.edu/degrees-certificates-curricula/prerequisite/
- **5. Maximum Units:** MSJC allows eligible high school students to request to take up to a maximum of 11 units during the fall and spring terms and 5 units during the summer term.
- **6. Tuition & Fees:** High school students are responsible for all college fees, including textbook, materials, transportation, parking, health fees. https://catalog.msjc.edu/student-fees/enrollment-fees/
- **7. Course Content/Material:** MSJC is an adult learning environment. As such, discussion topics and course materials are generally designed for adult students and may not be appropriate for younger students.
- **8. Course Registration:** It is the student's responsibility to log into Self-Service to register for approved courses on or after their registration date/time and in accordance with the MSJC deadlines.
- **9. Grades/College Credits:** The grade(s) earned in the MSJC course(s) taken will become part of the students official college academic record. College courses attempted, could impact future eligibility for Federal Financial Aid. https://www.msjc.edu/financialaid/
- **10. Student Responsibilities:** Students must act on their own behalf. Parents, guardians, relatives, or friends of MSJC students are **not** permitted to enroll, drop, or add classes on behalf of the student. The same applies to requesting transcripts or grade verifications.
- **11. Student Records:** Under Section 49061 of the CA Education Code, parents of community college students do not have a right of access to their students' records, regardless of whether the student is under the age of 18. In accordance with this regulation, students' college records will be released to parents only with the written consent of the student through a Consent for Release of Student Information.
- **12. Contacting Instructors:** Instructors work directly with students, as opposed to the type of parent interventions at the high school level. Under FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act), instructors are not required to discuss student performance or other student-related issues with parents. MSJC does not accommodate parent requests to contact instructors.

FERPA: The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records.
