# Helpful tips

# English

1. Ask your child what their homework is for the night.
2. Ask them what projects/tests/quizzes are coming up.
3. Have them show you what they just wrote, read it, edit it for them.
4. Don't feel like you can't just because they are in high school

# Math

1. **Don't tell your child "It's okay, I was terrible at math also"**
2. Ask to see the math work they did in class
3. Have them explain it to you
4. If they are working on Imagine Math (and they should be at home) ask them to show you the notes from the Imagine Math lesson.
  1. If they don't have notes, make them go back and take notes
  2. If they have notes and are failing quizzes have them talk to their teachers
