




MMHS Graduation Requirements

- Complete 40 hours of community service
- Demonstrate proficiency in Algebra I
- Complete the Senior Culminating Project (Oct. 24th, 2016)
- Pass Junior Reflective Essay
- 230 Credits in the following subjects:
 - English 4 years
 - Mathematics 3 years
 - Science 3 years (Physical/Life)
 - Social Science 3 years
 - Visual/Performing Arts 1 year
 - Foreign Language 1 year
 - Physical Education 2 years
 - Health/ICT Careers 1 year
 - General Electives 50 credits



Senior Graduation Check List

- Fulfill graduation requirements: 230 credits, 40 hours of community service, and complete the Senior Culminating Project
- Pass all of your classes
- Make up any credits
- Clear all debts by March 3rd, 2017
- Clear all discipline by December see Mrs. Rivera or Mrs. Fuentes
- Discipline, Grades, Taking Care of Business
- Plan your senior activities and develop a budget
- Plan for graduation
- Develop a plan for your future!

CSU/UC University Requirements A-G (C or better)

- English 4 years
- History 2 years
- Math 3 years (Alg. I, Geometry, Alg. II)
- Lab Science 2 years (Bio, Chemistry, Physics)
- VPA 1 year
- Foreign Language 2 years of the same lang.
- Elective 1 year
 - Colleges do not accept D grades either semester

College Preparation for Seniors

- Narrow your list of college/universities based on interest and your academic profile.
- Categorize by:
 - Reach/Highly Selective (Pick 2)
 - Selective (Pick 2)
 - Backups (Pick 2)
- Get applications and financial aid information online from each college/university.
- Retake ACT or SAT if needed (through December)
- Attend college/university preview days/open houses if possible. Go to each school/s website for dates. Virtual tours are also available for some colleges. (See College/Career Calendar)
- Create a master calendar and note <u>deadline/s</u> for test date/s, fee/s, application/s, financial aid application/s, letter/s of recommendation and transcript/s.

College Preparation for Seniors

- Write application essay/s and/or personal statements.
 Request various readers for revisions.
- Develop and finalize a resume.
- Check college/university for legal obligations regarding early decision or early action appls.
- Application filing period for CSU: Oct. 1- Nov. 30th.
- Application filing period for UC: Nov. 1 Nov. 30th.
- Check when applications are due for out-of-state and priva schools.
- Download letter of recommendation packet from MMHS webpage
- Make sure you check your email for college requests and deadlines

California State Universities

- Filing period: October 1 November 30
- Apply online: www.californiacolleges.edu
- Application fee: \$55 per campus
- Tuition costs: approx. \$5,000-\$7,000 per year
- Other expenses: \$16,000 \$20,000 (meals, housing and personal expenses)
- 23 campuses
- Requirements are based on the eligibility index score which varies per campus (see http://www.csumentor.edu/planning/high_school/)

California State Universities <u>Tips</u>

- Send SAT test scores to code 3594
 - This will send SAT test scores to all 23 Cal States
- Send ACT test scores to one Cal State
 - Use ACT Score manager at csumentor.edu to send ACT scores to other cal states
- Complete one CSU Application submit
 - If you apply to another CSU the application information will be pre-populated from the first application submitted

University of California

- Filing period: November 1 30
- Apply online: www.universityofcalifornia.edu/apply
- Application fee: \$70 per campus
- · Tuition costs: approx. \$13,400 per year
- Other expenses: \$16,000 \$19,200 (meals, housing and personal expenses)
- · 9 campuses
- Requirements are: 11 a-g courses by end of junior year with 3.0 GPA, SAT with writing or ACT with writing and comprehensive review process

University of California Tips

- Send SAT and ACT scores to one UC all UC will get them
- UC Berkeley require letters of recommendation now
- SAT Subject test scores are recommended but not required
 - They will only help not hurt an applicants chances of admission
- Be succinct when writing personal statements

The CSU/UC Timeline

- 10/1 11/30 Apply for CSU Admission (Start Apps on 10/1/16)
- 11/1 11/30 Apply for UC Admission (Start Apps Now!)
- 10/1 3/2 Apply for Financial Aid (FAFSA)
- 1/1 3/15
 Respond to request for additional info
 from colleges/universities (Check your email)
- 1/1 5/1 Admission Notification
- 5/1/2017 Letter of Intent to Register Due No Exceptions
- 3/1 5/30 Financial Aid Packages Received
- 5/1 6/30 Intent to Register (SIR) deposits due
- 07/01 Official Transcripts due to college
- 4/1 8/1 Housing, testing, orientation, preregistration, and registration

Private and/or Out-of-State Universities

- Commonapp.org / sendedu.org
- Filing period varies for each college/university.
- Students will need to research and contact each college/university for applications, procedures and timelines
- Application fees will vary by campus most will require letters of recommendation, resumes, essay/s, SATI/II or ACT with writing
- Tuition and overall cost will vary be aware of out-of-state tuition and/or residency requirements
- Refer http://www.wiche.edu/wue for the Western Undergraduate Exchange Program that waives out-of-state fees for California residents

Community Colleges

- Application period is usually in the Spring
- · Tuition cost approx. \$46 per unit
- Misc. fees are approx. \$300 per semester (not including books)
- MSJC, Palomar, and Riverside Community College are the local community colleges
- No SATs or ACT's are required students will need to complete a math and English assessment for placement
