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## **English Comp/Literature – area 'B'**

- > Area B Requirements
- > ESL/ELD



- > ACT/SAT/SAT Subject Test/AP & IB exams
- College courses



Q: A student took ESL/ELD courses in 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade. In 12<sup>th</sup> grade, the student enrolls in English 1 at Santa Monica College – a transferable English composition course – and passes the course with a C grade. Has this student met the area 'b' requirement?

A: Yes, a letter grade of C or better in a transferable English composition course will meet the entire 4-year area 'b' requirement.

Q: A student took the ACT combined English/Writing exam and received a score of 24 which satisfies 3 years of the requirement. They took English in each 9-11<sup>th</sup> grade but are not taking an English course in 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Have they met the area 'b' requirement?


A: No, the exam satisfies the first 3 years of the requirement, as opposed to any 3 years.





#### **Mathematics- Area 'C'**

Single discipline math sequence




- 3 years\* of mathematics required
- A geometry course must be attempted





#### **Mathematics- Area 'C'**

Integrated math sequence



- Integrated Math vs Single Discipline Math
  - Math I ≈ Algebra I
  - Math II ≈ Geometry
  - Math III ≈ Algebra II
  - Math IV ≈ Pre-Calculus or higher





## Combinations of Single Discipline and Integrated Mathematics



## **Mathematics Requirement**

Q1: True or False:

A "C" letter grade in a transferable college Calculus course will validate the entire math requirement.

**Q2: True or False:** 

Students who complete Algebra 1 and Geometry in 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> grades are still required to complete 3 more years of math in high school.

Q3: Based on the grades presented did the student meet the geometry requirement?

**Geometry:** C D

**AP Statistics:** C B





#### Language Other Than English (LOTE)

- Requirement: Two years, or the equivalent of the 2<sup>nd</sup> level of LOTE.
- High school level LOTE in 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade is acceptable.
- Higher levels validate lower levels.

Q1: A student took Chinese 1, 2 & 3 at Sunday Chinese School, which is not accredited and does not have an a-g course list. Have they met area 'e'?

**A:** No, students cannot use unapproved courses to meet area 'e.' *However*, the high school can choose to allow principal certification for the Chinese courses to meet the LOTE requirement.

Corresponds to two years of high school study

**Q2**: Student completes SPAN 1A only. Has the student met the LOTE requirement?

A: No, SPAN 1B is the course that corresponds to the 2<sup>nd</sup> level of high school study. SPAN 1A alone is not sufficient to meet the requirement.

#### **VPA** Criteria

- ☐ 1 yearlong course or 2 semesters from same discipline
- □ Online high school VPA courses acceptable if on a-g course list
- □ Online college VPA courses acceptable if transferable and 3 sem/4 qtr units each
- □ Students may repeat same VPA course multiple times for credit

- Q: Which of the courses above, if any, meets the VPA requirement?
- A: DANCEST 805 is the only course to meet the requirement; all other courses are only 1 unit each.







## Validation vs. Repeats

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### Validation vs. Repeats



- Completing the next level of a subject with a letter grade of C or better
- Does NOT replace a deficient grade
- Only allowed for MATH and LOTE



- For A-G courses where a D
   or F grade was earned
- Regular courses cannot repeat UC-approved honors courses
- Must have similar curriculum to the original course





#### Validation vs. Repeats

Q1: A student earned the following grades:

Biology A A

Chemistry D B

Has the student met the lab science requirement?

A: No. UC does not allow validation of lab science.

Q2: My student received a D in Intermediate Algebra in 10<sup>th</sup> grade, then took Pre-Calc in 11<sup>th</sup> grade and received a B.

Is the D grade calculated in their GPA?

A: Yes. Pre-Calc will validate the subject requirement, but the D grade can only be replaced if Intermediate Algebra is repeated.







- No request required







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#### **College Courses & Dual Enrollment**




College Courses are reported on the application with the honors designation of "CL"

#### **College Courses & Dual Enrollment**

Q: Should students enrolled in high school and college at the same time apply as a freshman or transfer?

A: If the student has not yet graduated from high school, they must apply as a freshman.


Q: Should high school students graduating early and taking college courses after graduation apply as freshmen or transfers?

A: It depends. Students should check with each campus they are applying to for their policy.





#### **Homeschooled Students**





#### **Out of State Transcripts**

- UC does NOT approve out of state courses or establish a-g course lists with non-CA schools (except online schools that serve CA students).
- A-G requirements must be completed with a letter "C" grade or better.
- Area F Visual and Performing Arts must be a one yearlong course or two semester courses from the same discipline.
- UC accepts "pass along" credit from out of state schools





#### **International & Domestic Transcripts**

All courses must be reported as they appear on the original records.

Utilize the "Additional Comments" section for assistance with review.

- Explain grading systems.
- Repetition of academic years.
- Explain grading trends.

UC requires official International records and US domestic transcript.





#### Meeting A-G with international work

Completion of areas B (English) & E (LOTE) is determined by the language of instruction (LOI) at the local school.

Area F (Visual and Performing Art) can be completed abroad.

If graduating from a U.S. school, U.S. History must be completed in the U.S.





#### **Online Courses**



Must be UC-approved online high school courses OR U.S regionally accredited college/university online courses.

UC approved courses must be on the A-G Course List for the "physical" school OR the online school

Laboratory science courses must include teacher-supervised, hands-on labs for at least 20% of class.

Principal Certification of online courses is not acceptable





#### **Online Courses**

#### **Online School**

- Instruction is conducted primarily over the internet
- Must be regionallyaccredited in order for courses to meet a-g subject requirements
- Example: BYU Independent Study High School, APEX Learning Virtual School

#### **Online Publisher**

- Develops curriculum which they sell or license to local high school or district.
- Course is taught and credit issued by the home high school, not the publisher
- Example: BYU High School Suite, APEX Learning





## **Principal Certification**

- Courses must be comparable to other college-prep courses
- Careful review of curriculum and/or testing the student's academic ability is required
- Include course title, letter grades, and units earned on the home transcript
