**macroscopic** large enough to be visible to the naked eye

**microscope** (mkrskohp) magnifier of the image of small objects

**periscope** (prskohp) an optical instrument that provides a view of an otherwise obstructed field

**symposium** (smpohzm) a meeting or conference for the public discussion of some topic especially one in which the participants form an audience and make presentations

**synchronize** (sngkrnz) cause to indicate the same time or rate

**syndrome** (sndrohnm) a pattern of symptoms indicative of some disease

**synergy** (snûrj) The working together of two things (muscles or drugs for example) to produce an effect greater than the sum of their individual effects.

**synonym** (snnm) two or more different words that have the same, or nearly the same, meaning

**syntax** (sntks)

1. the grammatical arrangement of words in sentences
2. studies of the rules for forming admissible sentences

**telescope** (tlskohp)

1. make smaller or shorter
2. an instrument that gathers light to make faraway objects appear larger, closer, and Clearer
