apology: an expression of regret at having caused trouble for someone

catalog: 1. a book or pamphlet containing an enumeration of things 2. a complete list of things; usually arranged systematically

epilogue: 1. a short speech (often in verse) addressed directly to the audience by an actor at the end of a play 2. a short passage added at the end of a literary work

eulogy: A formal expression of praise, especially at a funeral.

megalith: A very large stone used in various prehistoric architectures or monumental styles, notably in western Europe during the second millennium B.C.

monologue: 1. a speech made by one person 2. a drama that is carried out by one person

neolithic: latest part of the Stone Age beginning about 10,000 BC in the middle east (but later elsewhere)

Paleolithic: second part of the Stone Age beginning about 750,000 to 500,000 years BC and lasting until the end of the last ice age about 8,500 years BC
