proclivity (prohkl ǐvũtē) A natural or habitual inclination or tendency,(especially of human character or behavior)

profuse (prũfy 00s) produced or growing in extreme abundance

prologue (prohl 0g) opening speech or dialogue of a play or the introduction to any literary work

provoke (prũvohk) annoy continually or chronically

rejuvenate (r ǐj 00vũn 0t) return to life; get or give new life or energy

secede (s ǐs 0d) withdraw from an organization or communion

sedition (s ǐd ǐshũn) an illegal action inciting resistance to lawful authority and tending to cause the disruption or overthrow of the government

subconscious (sũbk 0nshũs) Not wholly conscious; existing in the mind but not fully perceived or recognized.

submarine (sũbmũr 0n) a submersible warship usually armed with torpedoes

subterranean (sũbtũr 0n 0ũn) being or operating under the surface of the earth
