2.	diameter	dia-, <u>through, across</u> + meter, <u>measure, to measure</u>
3.	debilitate	de-, <u>away, down, out, apart</u> + bilitate

5.	conclusion	con-, <u>with, together</u> + clus, <u>to close</u> + ion

circumvent (sûrkũmvĕnt) avoid or try to avoid fulfilling, answering, or performing (duties, questions, or issues)

commemorate (kũmĕmũrĕt) call to remembrance; keep alive the memory of someone or something, as in a ceremony

conclusion (kũnklõzhũn)

1. the proposition arrived at by logical reasoning (such as the proposition that must follow from the major and minor premises of a syllogism)
2. the act of ending something

contraction (kũntrĕkshũn) the process or result of becoming smaller or pressed together

contrite (kũntrĭt)

1. feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses
2. feeling regret for a fault or offence

debilitate (dũbĭũtĕt) make weak

desist (dĭsĭst) choose to refrain or discontinue.

destruction (dĭstrũkshũn) an event or the result of an event that completely destroys something

diameter (dĭĕmũtũr) the length of a straight line passing through the center of a circle and connecting two points on the circumference

diaphanous so thin as to transmit light
