



INFORMATION REGARDING IMMUNIZATIONS

Please read carefully below to determine the time your student is scheduled for photos as well as opportunities for make-ups.

- All students MUST adhere to safety protocols. This includes wearing a mask the entire time other than during the photo. Students who fail to comply will be dismissed from campus.
- Photos are taken inside the MPR.
- Parents must remain in vehicles and parked in the parking lot (not in the loop) unless otherwise arranged with the front office.
