The History of Artist Trading Cards

Artist Trading Cards are individual art miniatures which are traded hand to hand. A Swiss artist by the name of Vänçi Stirnemann may have started the ATC movement when he created 1200 ATCs for an art exhibit in 1996. He inspired other artists to make their own art on trading card-sized paper and they all got together and traded their artwork, which is how ATCs got started.

Need to make ATCs? Make your own blank cards by using paperboard boxes (cereal, tissue, other boxes), cardboard, old greeting cards, manila folders (used ones work too!), cardstock, posterboard, heavy scrapbook paper. Cover up anything you don't like with paint, paper or just collage over it.

IDEAS FOR ATCS

- ★ Drawings
your favorite things to draw
- ★ Paintings
watercolor, acrylic, any kind of paint
- ★ designs
look around for inspiration
- ★ Circles
make a design out of circles
- ★ Lines
draw lines and add color
- ★ Collage
magazine pictures and words
- ★ Monogram Letters
draw a letter and decorate it

MORE IDEAS!

Mix different mediums

for example, paint, then add marker or pen/pencil, or cut pictures and words from magazines then add marker

Use art supplies you have at home

This could even be stickers, stamps, crayons, colored pencils - whatever you already have

Work on multiple cards at one time

might as well work on 2 or 3 cards at the same time

Make them with friends

It's fun to make art in a group and get inspired by others
