On October 26th, 4 NightHawk Robotics teams spent all day competing at Poway HS in this years VEX Robotics Game – Tower Takeover. After 9 qualifying matches 3 of our 4 teams advanced to the playoff elimination rounds. All 3 of our teams advanced to the finals where an all Nighthawk alliance (Teams 569A & 569B) would have to play 569C and their alliance partner from another school for the championship. After an exciting match Team 569C and their alliance partner were crowned Tournament Champions. Team 569C also won the most prestigious award you can win at a robotics tournament, the Excellence Award. Team 569B brought home 3 awards – Tournament Finalist, Skills Champion, and the Design Award. Periods 2-7:

Students need a pass from attendance if they are going to be late to class. We conduct tardy sweeps; late students need to go to the attendance window to obtain a pass to class.

Tardy Consequences:

Monday morning detentions as explained above. If discipline is not served, students are placed on the No Go List and are unable to participate in activities.

Drop-off Policy

We do not accept delivery of items or phone messages for students including books, homework, jackets, lunches, phones, phone chargers, water bottles, sports equipment, balloons, flowers, gifts, money, delivered food items or messages given to students during class time. Please do not ask our staff to accept or deliver these items.

Info From the Health Office:

Students who become ill during the school day may go to the Health Office during class time with a pass from the teacher, or anytime during break or lunch. Students are **NOT ALLOWED** to text/call parents to be called out of class for illness. We are not able to call the classrooms during class time.

Parents who are here to pick their students up from the Health Office will go directly to the Welcome Center and will need their photo ID.

Students who have an oral temperature of 100F or higher, or are vomiting, **MUST** go home and may not drive themselves.

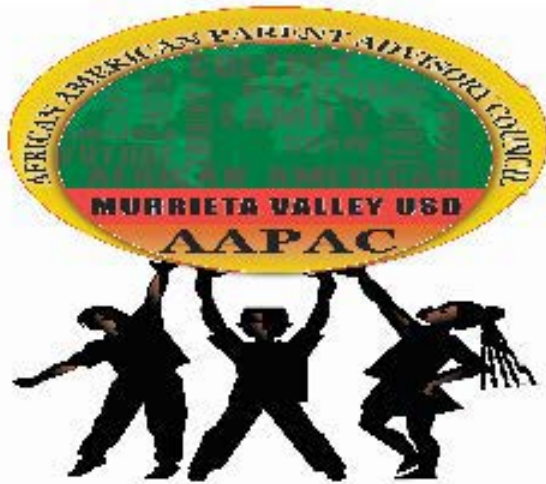

Step 2: PAY ONLINE WITH TOTAL REGISTRATION WEBSITE www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/052073

We recommend that parents and students are both present while registering on Total Registration to ensure that the correct exams are ordered. Students/parents should click on the link provided on the school website or visit the website listed above. Registration is not complete until students have printed the confirmation page that is provided at the end of the registration process.

Important Registration Dates:

Regular Registration (September 20 - Nov 8, 2019)

\$98 per exam before Friday, Nov 8th, 2019

Students/Parents may use Total Registration payment plan option which will require a \$40 deposit per exam
FULL PAYMENTS must be received by March 15, 2020

Late Registration (Nov 9 - Nov 14, 2019)

\$98 + \$10 (late fee) per exam

Financial Aid: Fees for AP exams are reduced to \$5 for low-income families. To request a fee reduction, the student must have an approved 2019-2020 application for Free or Reduced lunch. Applications can be submitted at <https://fma.murrieta.k12.ca.us> (approval may take up to 10 days).

Refund and Cancellation Policy: Late fees are non-refundable

- Students who cancel an exam by Thu - Nov 14, 2019 are entitled to a full refund of the exam fee.
- Students who cancel an exam by Fri - Mar 13, 2020 are entitled to a refund of the exam fee minus a cancellation fee of \$40.00 (per exam cancelled).
- After Mar 15, 2020 there are no refunds
