Dear Parents and Students,

It is hard to believe it is already March and we are officially in the last 12 weeks of the school year. The resilience and hard work of our students to make this year great is appreciated by our staff. Thank you for your continued effort to be the best you can be each day.

This month our 11th graders will be taking the CAASPP (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress). The last time the CAASPP was given in California was 2019 when our current 11th graders were in 8th grade. The test is given in every grade from 3rd through 8th, but in high school it is only given to 11th graders. The CAASPP is used to monitor student progress and ensure that all students leave high school ready for college and career. Our 11th graders will be assessed in the areas of Math and English. We are excited to share with you the incentives that students will receive by showing proficiency on this assessment. (Incentive Flyer below)

### 2022 CAASPP TESTING INCENTIVES

### #1: Earn 2022 Homecoming Tickets

All Juniors scoring **3 (Standard Met)** or **4 (Standard Exceeded)** on Math <u>AND</u> English receive a **free ticket** for the 2022 Homecoming Dance

### #2: Win 2023 Prom Tickets

All Juniors who meet #1 above will also be entered in a raffle. **Five students** will win free 2023 Prom tickets for Senior Year.

### #3: Math - Transcript Grade Bump

With a proficient score of 3 or 4 on Math subtest, students can select any semester class of Math I, II, or III and apply a grade bump – F to D, D to C, C to B.

Students may bump a B to an A with a score of 4.

You must score 4 (Standard Exceeded) to bump a grade in an advance course – Math I, Math II, or Math III.

### #4: ELA - Transcript Grade Bump

With a proficient score of 3 or 4 on English subtest, students can select a semester of English 11 and apply a grade bump - F to D only.

Grade bumps may not apply to AP or IB courses.


