Letter From Our Principal









Dear Parents and Students,

It is hard to believe it is already March and we are officially in the last 12 weeks of the school year. The resilience and hard work of our students to make this year great is appreciated by our staff. Thank you for your continued effort to be the best you can be each day.

This month our 11th graders will be taking the CAASPP (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress). The CAASPP is an assessment given each spring to all 3rd-8th graders and 11th graders in California. The CAASPP began during the 2014 school year to assess Math and ELA (English Language Arts) and the primary purpose is to assist teachers, administrators, students, and parents by promoting high-quality teaching and learning through the use of a variety of assessment approaches and item types. During the 2021 school year the state created the CAST (California Science Test). The 11th graders will begin testing the week of March 13th in their Science class. The ELA portion of the CAASPP will be taken in your student's English class during the dates of March 16-March 23. The Math portion will be taken from April 18-April 21st. There are no adjustments to daily schedules and the assessments will be taken in class with their teacher. Our staff truly values the feedback the results provide and to encourage students to give their best effort we have some amazing incentives. Please take a

2023 CAASPP / CAST INCENTIVES

#1: Earn Homecoming Tickets

All Juniors scoring 3 (Standard Met) or 4 (Standard Exceeded) on two of three tests (Math, English, Science) will receive a FREE ticket for the 2023 Homecomina Dance.

#2: Win 2024 Prom Tickets

All Juniors who meet #1 above will also be entered in a raffle.

Five students will win FREE 2024 Prom tickets for Senior Year.

#3: Math - Transcript Grade Bump

With a proficient score of 3 or 4 on Math subtest, students can select any semester class of Math I, II, or III and apply a grade bump – F to D, D to C, C to B. Students may bump a B to an A with a score of 4.

You must score 4 (Standard Exceeded) to bump a grade in an advanced course – Math I, Math II, or Math III.

#4: ELA - Transcript Grade Bump

With a proficient score of 3 or 4 on English subtest, students can select a semester of English 11 and apply a grade bump - F to D only.

Grade bumps do not apply to advanced courses.

#5: Science - Transcript Grade Bump

With a proficient score of 3 or 4 on CAST Science test, students can select a semester of science and apply a grade bump - F to D only.

Grade bumps do not apply to advanced courses



NIGHTHAWK HIGHLIGHTS!!!



GOSCH FORD TEMECULA LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS



Extremely happy to announce that our annual Squad Games was a blast for cadets!


The 12 Squad Leaders came together and planned this event in its entirety, with the main goal of creating a competition for each squad to compete for the honor of winning the trophy.





SELF CARE

According to the National Institute of Mental Health, self-care means "taking the time to do things that help you live well and improve both your physical health and mental health. When it comes to your mental health, self-care can help you manage stress, lower your risk of illness, and increase your energy. Even small acts of self-care in your daily life can have a big impact". It is vital to remember that "selfcare looks different for everyone, and it is important to find what you need and enjoy. It may take trial and error to discover what works best for you. In addition, although self-care is not a cure for mental illnesses, understanding what causes or triggers your mild symptoms and what coping techniques work for you can help manage your mental health".

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOUR CHILD IS SICK AT SCHOOL

If your student is not feeling well and texting you from school: Encourage your child to go to the health office where we can assist them or contact parents if needed. Students with a fever over 100.1 or if they are vomiting must go home within 30 minutes.

If you are coming to pick up your ill student, please call ahead to the Health Office (ext. 5257) to let us know, so we can locate them if they are not in the health office. It may take up to 15 - 30 minutes to locate them and release them out of class. We do not call into classrooms during instructional time unless there is an emergency, students are expected to ask their teacher to go to the health office when they are not feeling well, or we will send out a hall pass for them to come to the health office.

Ill students waiting to be picked up must wait in the health office. Students going home from the health office will be released to parent or designated adult at the Main Gate Welcome Center. We do not release students for non-emergency illness to siblings, grandparents, or emergency contacts without first having verbal parent permission. Students leaving early for appointments or personal reasons will be released through the Attendance Office. (ext. 8743)

Medication at School

Medications normally are best administered at home, but there are times when medication must be administered at school. If your child needs a medication during school hours please view our medication policy and procedure on our Murrieta Valley High School website or contact our school Health Office.
