Dear Parents and Students.

We have had a great start to the 2022-2023 school year! Our first day of school was devoted to connecting with students, focusing on student social and emotional needs, procedures, and school spirit. Our school motto for the year is, "Catch the Spirit", as our mission is to build relationships with students and to impact their lives both academically and emotionally. Our staff has truly loved having students back on campus!

We held our Welcome/Expectations assemblies for all 9th graders during the first week of school and our students who are new as a 10th, 11th, or 12th grader are participating in the assembly this week. We began our "Office Hours," which is in-school intervention, the second week of school. Office Hours takes place on Thursdays and Fridays after the first block and students visit the teacher of their choice to receive additional academic support. Additionally, our AVID tutors are available to meet with any student needing support from 8:15 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. in the library on Wednesday mornings.

We encourage our students to get involved on campus. Students were given a survey the first day of school through the 5-Star App and the student interest feedback is being used to connect students with activities they enjoy.

Our Homecoming Dance is on Saturday September 24th from 7:00-11:00 p.m. and it is always the most attended event of the year.

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We held Club Rush last week and it was extremely successful. We have a variety of clubs for students to connect with and if your student has a desire to start a club have them visit the Hawk Rock.

Our academic programs include International Baccalaureate (IB) and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Our 8 CTE pathways include: Foods, Photography, Business, Auto Mechanics, Engineering, Law Enforcement, Computer Programming, and Fire Science. We also have the Mount San Jacinto Community College annex on our campus where students can take classes for dual credit. If you are interested in any of our programs our counselors are a great resource.

Our academic competitions include Mock Trial, Virtual Enterprise, and Robotics. There is something for every student between our award-winning Performing Arts mixed with our successful Athletic Programs. We also have strong leadership programs on campus to allow our students to take ownership of our growing and engaging culture. Leadership classes include Marine Junior ROTC, Senate, ASB, PLUS, Link Crew, and Night Hawk Pride.



WARNING SIGNS OF SUICIDE:

The behaviors listed below may be some of the signs that someone is thinking about suicide.

TALKING ABOUT:



- > Wanting to die
- □ Great guilt or shame
- Deing a burden to others

FEELING:



- Empty, hopeless, trapped, or having no reason to live
- Extremely sad, more anxious, agitated, or full of rage
- Unbearable emotional or physical pain

CHANGING BEHAVIOR, SUCH AS:



- Making a plan or researching ways to die
- Withdrawing from friends, saying good bye, giving away important items, or making a will
- Taking dangerous risks such as driving extremely fast
- Displaying extreme mood swings
- Eating or sleeping more or less
- Using drugs or alcohol more often

If these warning signs apply to you or someone you know, get help as soon as possible, particularly if the behavior is new or has increased recently.
