WHAT TO DO WHEN YOUR CHILD IS SICK AT SCHOOL

<u>If your student is not feeling well and texting you from school</u>: Encourage your child to go to the health office where we can assist them or contact parents if needed. Students with a fever over 100.1 or if they are vomiting must go home within 30 minutes.

If you are coming to pick up your ill student, please call ahead to the Health Office (ext. 5257) to let us know, so we can locate them if they are not in the health office. It may take up to 15 – 30 minutes to locate them and release them out of class. We do not call into classrooms during instructional time unless there is an emergency, students are expected to ask their teacher to go to the health office when they are not feeling well, or we will send out a hall pass for them to come to the health office.

Ill students waiting to be picked up must wait in the health office. Students going home from the health office will be released to parent or designated adult at the Main Gate Welcome Center. We do not release students for non-emergency illness to siblings, grandparents, or emergency contacts without first having verbal parent permission.

Students leaving early for appointments or personal reasons will be released through the Attendance Office. (ext. 8743)




