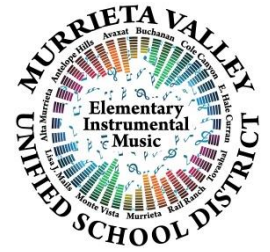


# FLUTE – Changing Notes

Reminder: We don't use the Left Hand pinky key until 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. Don't touch it.



## Bb to F

Finger Bb and then add LEFT hand 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> finger to go to F.

## Bb to C

Finger Bb and then release LEFT hand thumb and RIGHT hand 1<sup>st</sup> finger to go to C.

D to C Finger D, notice how your LH 1<sup>st</sup> finger and RH Pinky are in the air, and then switch all of your fingers to go to C (except LH pinky). It is exactly opposite all of your fingers.

## D to Eb

Finger D and then just add the RIGHT hand pinky key to go to Eb. It is so easy!!!
