
this busy season. Happy Holidays! From the 2nd grade team.


Student Lunches and Cafeteria Meals

The Blazer Way Moment Being Safe: Reporting Trouble or Emergencies

When do students know when to tell an adult about something? As parents and teachers we try to train them not to tattle tale, but what about if it is real trouble or an emergency, how can they tell the difference? Who should they go to and what should they say? These are difficult questions to answer, especially when we are talking about students who are so young. Yet, here we are, in a day and an age where we need to teach students to speak up when they see or hear of trouble.

Below is a guideline for reporting trouble or an emergency. It does not fit every situation, but it does provide a starting point. A starting point to help young students calmly and accurately report situations that may help others or may help themselves.












One of the key points we can stress from the above tips, make sure to teach your student what an appropriate adult or authority figure is. At school, train them to look for a badge or a volunteer sticker signifying they are a safe person to approach. Reporting trouble or an emergency will help keep all of the Buchanan community safe, and being safe is a big part of following the Blazer Way.

MVUSD Health Services - Head Lice





Head lice are small insects that are generally found on the scalp, around the ears, and at the back of the neck. The adult louse is about the size of a sesame seed, and can be the color of your hair. Nits (eggs) are smaller and silver in color. Nits stick to the hair shaft and do not easily flake off hair.

Head lice do not transmit disease. Head lice are not a sign of poor hygiene. Lice cannot jump and cannot fly. Lice may spread from one person to another if there is direct head to head contact, or by sharing of personal items such as combs, brushes, hats, or helmets. Lice usually die within two days without a human host.

The most common symptom of head lice is itching and head scratching, particularly at night. Redness or sores from scratching may also be noticed. If you suspect that your child has head lice, we suggest you contact your health care provider. Safe and effective products to treat head lice are available both over the counter and by a doctor prescription. It is important to follow the directions carefully. In addition, use a fine-tooth comb or special nit comb to help remove the nits. You can also check your child's scalp weekly when the hair is wet to see if there are any new head lice. Wash in hot water all recently worn clothing, hats, used bedding and towels. Personal care items such as combs, brushes and hair clips should be washed in hot water. Toys, such as stuffed animals, can be put in a tightly closed plastic bag for fourteen days or placed in a hot dryer for 30 minutes.

Notify the School Health Office if your child has head lice. The best treatment is prevention.

Counselor's Corner

Bust Bullying Behavior!

Bullying in school has taken place for a long time, perhaps since schools first began. We are finally looking at this problem and trying to find ways to solve it. Children who are victims are being taught the tools for combating verbal and physical assaults. We must also address the needs of the child who is committing these acts. He needs help as well.

If you suspect your child may be a bully, open up a discussion about it. You can ask your child if he's ever done any of the following:

- Teased other children, been mean to them, or made fun of the way they look or speak
- · Spread nasty rumors about a student at school
- Called students names to publicly humiliate them
- Kicked, shoved, punched, or pushed another student for no reason
- Used the internet to post nasty pictures or messages
- Excluded other students from joining a game or group activity

Your child may not realize that these are bullying behaviors. He/she may think it's an innocent way to have fun with friends.

Have a discussion with your child about his affect on others. Remind him of a time when his feelings were hurt. Explain that he may be inflicting the same pain on somebody else. Have your child imagine that he's the victim. Encourage him to talk about the feelings he might experience if the roles were reversed.

There are a variety of reasons your child may be bullying others. Keep the discussion open to these possibilities. Perhaps your child enjoys the attention he gets from his friends. Maybe he's feeling angry about something else and is taking it out on a weaker classmate. Or, bullying may be a way for your child to feel important and valued. The only way to find out is to have an honest dialog with him. Give your child the opportunity to talk about his thoughts and feelings without fear of being punished.

Your child may feel peer pressure to continue his bullying behavior. He might fear being ostracized if he doesn't. Talk to your child about the strength of character that's required to do the right thing. Encourage him to stand up for what he knows is right. These are important values that your child needs to learn from you.

A wonderful video called <u>The Bully Dance</u> is available to watch on YouTube. This video can help parents talk about all aspects of bullying behavior.

You and your child are always welcome to talk to a teacher, counselor, or administrator about a bullying situation. We're all here to help.

School counseling in the classroom...

The elementary schools in our district utilize the Second Step program to provide monthly counseling lessons in grades 4 and 5. The Second Step program teaches children important skills for getting along with others and doing well in school. It also helps our school be a safe, respectful place where everyone can learn. To further help our school be a safe and respectful place, we are also going to use the Second Step Bullying Prevention Unit. In this unit, your child will learn specific skills to help stop bullying. Students will learn how to:

- Recognize when bullying is happening, report bullying to a caring adult, and refuse to let bullying happen
- Be a bystander who helps stop bullying
- Support someone being bullied by standing up for that person and being kind and inclusive
- Recognize, report, and refuse cyber bullying when they see or know about it happening

•	January 3	District accepts <u>New</u> and <u>Renewal</u> Inter-District Transfers
•	February 1	Online Pre-enrollment begins for all students new to the Murrieta Valley Unified School District, including Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten students.
•	February 13	Final day of Open Enrollment for New or Renewal of <u>Inter</u> -District transfer requests.
•	February 13	Final day to submit <i>(NEW)</i> INTRADISTRICT transfer requests at the School Site.
•	March 6	Onsite enrollment appointments begin for Transitional Kindergarten, Kindergarten and New enrollees. Please contact the school site to make an appointment to complete registration and turn in documents <i>such as</i> , birth certificate/verification of age, immunization records, verification of residency and more depending on the grade level of your student.
•	June 09	Open Enrollment <u>INTRA</u> -district and <u>INTER</u> -district Transfer notifications to parents will be sent no later than this date. *All other transfers that are turned in after 2/13/17 will be considered case by case
