

Third Grade News

Ms. Corbett, Mrs. Morgan, and Mr. Nickoloff's classes will be taking a field trip to the Santa Rosa Plateau on Friday, March 3. Students will have an opportunity to hike and participate in other activities at the Nature Center. 3rd grade students will take the CAASPP in April and May this year. We have started looking at some of the practice tests in class to give students an idea of what the test will look like and how to

navigate through it. This is an excellent opportunity to focus on having a growth mindset and learning from mistakes. Third grade is beginning to explore fractions, and that they are a part of a whole. You can help your child by allowing them to experiment with fractions at home using measuring cups, rulers and clocks. How many $\frac{1}{4}$ cups make 1 cup? How many inches in a half of a foot? What is a half an hour, a quarter hour? Look for opportunities to share with your third grader how you use fractions.



Fourth Grade News

By now your fourth grader should be well into working on fractions. Please continue to encourage your child to use their fraction tiles, draw models, and most importantly; be able to explain their answers to all their mathematical reasoning! Also, as your child completes projects, please have them check to be sure all parts

Positive Behavioral Supports Moment

What does it mean to be respectful? One meaning is to be careful not to do anything against someone's wishes or rights. This definition reminds a person of a very old saying called the golden rule which says, "One should treat others as one would like others to

treat one self." Think of how positive our school might look if we all took a moment to think of the kind of respect we would want others to treat us with.

This can also refer to how we care and respect school property and the property of others. Think of these steps as the 'Golden Rule' of caring for others' property:

- 1. Use others' property only with their permission.
- 2. Make an appropriate request if you want to use something that belongs to another person.
- 3. Use others' property only as it is supposed to be used or according to instructions.
- 4. Take care of others' property as if it was your own.
- 5. If something gets broken, apologize and offer to replace it.

So many times being respectful means thinking about others first. The same can go for school property and the property of others. If we treated the property of others' with more care than even our own property, then people would be more comfortable sharing. As many teachers and parents will say, sharing is caring. Remember, Be Respectful is a core value of the Blazer Way. When we show others that we can respect property, then we have built something that makes us a Trail Blazer.

Dear Buchanan Families,

As we stated in February, the 2017 California state assessments start the weeks following spring break (**April 10**th **through May 25**th). All Buchanan students who are grades 3-5 will participate. Teachers will communicate individual grade testing schedules as testing gets closer.

How can students prepare? At school the students already are. The teachers have been designing lessons all year that meet state standards and help students progress towards the goal of being college and career ready. The Reading Inventory and Math Inventory assessments have helped students monitor their own goals for learning. Students and teachers have begun to work through CAASPP practice tests that look and feel like the real thing. They are also completing what are called Interim Assessments. These short assessments use the same format as the state assessments this April and May. The difference is that they focus on individual skills in the areas of Language Arts or Math.


So what can parents do to help prepare their students? You can have the students look at practice tests as well. The link below will take you directly to the login page for the CAASPP practice tests:

Counselor's Corner

How to Help Your Child Overcome Test Anxiety

In a typical school day, several students will experience at least a small bout of anxiety when it comes to testing to one degree or another. Here are some strategies that can be used to successfully help your child overcome test anxiety.



Step 1:

When a student is preparing for an exam, they should devote a certain amount of time each day to studying the material that the test will cover. Time management skills often play a large role when it comes to actually studying, and comprehending the material. If your child tends to procrastinate a little in this

area, then attempts to absorb all the material in at once, it is quite likely that they will encounter anxiety when the actual test is put on their desk.

Step 2:

You should encourage your students to keep any and all notes and other materials organized in a folder or binder. This way, while they are preparing for their test, they can easily reference material that has been covered. Creating a "study space" that is organized. This will allow them a dedicated location for reviewing and learning new material.

Step 3:

Students may experience anxiety due to lack of self-confidence, a low amount of motivation, pressure in the classroom and/or at home, or they may simply be afraid of performing to the extent in which they fail. If you uncover any of these issues, it is important to fully support your child to help them overcome the issues at hand. By doing this, you are also helping them overcome their test anxiety.

Step 4:

Many kids refrain from asking questions in class in front of other students for fear that they may become made fun of, or they may not fit in among their peers. Let your child know that by not asking questions for clarification, they are not learning the information. Asking questions can not only benefit them but also their classmates who may have similar questions.

Step 5:

Practicing relaxation and breathing exercises if students start to feel anxious during testing can also be helpful. These types of exercises will help the student relax and focus on the questions without going blank. If they seem to still have an issue with it, it may be best to inform the child to let their teacher know of the complications that they are having.



encourage positive self-talk to your child.

When they start to feel as if they "can't", tell them to tell themselves that they "CAN!" Let them know that while fear is an important part to keeping us safe, that they do not have to fear a test. Using positive self-talk and using calming strategies they can overcome test anxiety.

- November 7 School Sites Accept <u>NEW</u> Intra-District Trans requests.
 *Intra-District = A transfer between schools in the MVUSD
- January 3 District accepts <u>New</u> and <u>Renewal</u> Inter-District Transfers
- February 1 Online Pre-enrollment begins for all students new to the Murrieta Valley Unified School District, including Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten students.
- February 13 Final day of Open Enrollment for New or Renewal of <u>Inter</u>-District transfer requests.
- February 13 Final day to submit (NEW) INTRADISTRICT transfer requests at the School Site.
- March 6 Onsite enrollment appointments begin for Transitional Kindergarten, Kindergarten and New enrollees. Please contact the school site to make an appointment to complete registration and turn in documents *such as*, birth certificate/verification of age, immunization records, verification of residency and more depending on the grade level of your student.
- June 09 Open Enrollment <u>INTRA</u>-district and <u>INTER</u>-district Transfer notifications to parents will be sent no later than this date.
 *All other transfers that are turned in after 2/13/17 will be considered case by case

NOTE: Intra Transfer Requests between schools within the Murrieta Valley School District are processed at the school site. Please submit the request at the school site that you are requesting.
