#### Procedure For Teacher Assignment Notification for the 2017-2018 School Year

Teacher assignment notification for the 2017-2018 school year for all students in grades Transitional Kindergarten thru 5th grade will take place August 8th thru August 10th during the hours of 9am-12pm.

Please visit our school website at murrieta.k12.ca.us/buchanan for information on when the Parent Portal will open. Once the portal opens, you will go in and verify or make changes to all the data information. An automated phone call will also be sent out when the parent portal opens, so make sure the office has your current phone number on file. All data must be updated and a current utility bill in the parents name dated June or July presented to receive your child's teacher assignment. During August the 8th-10th registration, you will complete a health information form and we will verify the utility bill and that the data confirmation in the parent portal is complete. Once we verify that everything has been completed, you will receive your child's teacher assignment for the school year.

Parents are <u>highly encouraged</u> to complete the above information prior to August 8<sup>th.</sup> Waiting until the last moment will result in long lines and possibly delay your student starting school on August 16th. We also <u>highly encourage</u> those of you with new students to Buchanan Elementary to enroll your child beginning Monday, July 31, 2017 thru Friday, August 11, 2017 when our office reopens from the summer break.

#### Important Safety Reminders

**Drop-off** is 8:00-8:25am for grades 1-5. Morning TK/K begins promptly at 8:20 am, Afternoon TK/K begins promptly at 11:00am.

Each morning when the 8:25am TARDY BELL rings, staff members will be at each entry gate to give out tardy slips and teachers will send any student not in class or on their line to the office for a tardy slip.

Pick-up is 2:35 pm for grades 1-3. Grades 4-5 is 2:40 pm. Afternoon K is 2:35 pm. No staff is available to watch students before 8:00am and after 3:00pm.

Students need to be picked up by 3:00pm. If you need supervision after 3pm, child care is available on campus for a fee. Please call our Family Services at 951-304-1623 for more information if you are interested in before or after school child care.

Please remember to keep moving up in the loop as cars leave and do not leave your car unattended. Our goal is to keep our children safe!

#### **How To Survive Summer Break**

Parents have a love/hate relationship with summer. They are excited to have their children home more, excited to not have so many responsibilities (places to be), but may feel anxious about all the time that will need to be filled.

There are lots of resources and ideas for activities and things to do during the summer months, but here are some general thoughts to help ease the anxiety that might be threatening your summer fun.

**Allow your family to have down time.** It is not necessary to schedule every minute. It may be nice to not to have so many places to be.

**Don't abandon routine.** As nice as down time is, a completely unstructured summer may lead to boredom or chaos in the house. Stick to chores and responsibilities that are appropriate for their ages and abilities and be sure those things are taken care of each day.

**Consider service.** One of the best things we can do for our children, is teach them the importance of serving and helping others. While you are planning your summer activities, include some service oriented activities.

**Plan ahead.** Take a few minutes to do some research about all the fun things your city has to offer over the next few months. **Ask for input.** Ask your children what they want to do this summer. They have been dreaming about it too!
