### Third Grade News

Third grade has jumped into a brand new reading program! We are teaching reading foundation lessons and routines that will be used all year long. We are working on sustained reading which is reading for longer periods of time, 20 minutes or more of thoughtful silent reading emersion, with the focus of greater comprehension. Read to Self and Picking a just right book are very important to be a successful reader. And we will be using their Lexile leveled reader to practice reading which will then lead to more independent readers. Also, establishing a writing foundation using a writer's notebook to

write about what interests them for greater lengths of time. Many of these foundation lessons will set these children up for success and create a community that has stamina while both reading and writing. In math we are establishing routines using Number Talks and Learning Carpet plus Go Math. We are very busy building positive mind set for all readers and math students. One uplifting quote that helps me while teaching is "Positive thinking will let you do everything better."

### Fourth Grade News

Thank you parents for attending our Back to School Night! It was a great to meet so many of you and an excellent way to start the year! As we continue to work on developing procedures and routines in the classroom, we are fostering Growth Mindset in our students. We appreciate your support as we move ahead this year and look forward to many

new learning opportunities.

### Fifth Grade News

The fifth graders have spent the past few weeks settling into the school year and classroom routines. Band started on August 30th. We have approximately 85 students enrolled in band this year! The students have taken the first RI test of the school year. We are very proud of how

hard the kids persevered during the test. Their Lexile levels are amazing. We have started our Math UA rotations. Students are working on mastering the concepts in Chapter I. During each academic and UA rotation, the kids will continue to hear the teachers refer to a Growth Mindset. We all have areas that we need to improve on and challenges we need to strengthen.

### Educational Specialists

Welcome back to another wonderful school year. Buchanan offers an array of Special education services here on campus. We have two full-time Resources Specialists, One half-day Resource Specialist, two Special Day classes for Pre-school, K-2 Mild/Moderate Special Day class, 3-

5th Mild/moderate upper Special Day class, two and a half Speech Pathologists, an occupational Therapist, Adaptive Physical Education Teacher, Physical Therapist, Intensive Behavior Intervention for pre-school, Full time school psychologist, Counselors, Vision Itinerates, and Deaf/hard of hearing specialist. Supports are provided to students who qualify based on the Eligibity criteria.

### Celebration Policy

### We Need Your Help in the Parking Lot



Student safety is our number one concern. It is extremely important that parents and students use the crosswalk when walking to and from the parking lot.

If you are picking up your children in your car, please ask them to wait for you in front of the Multi Purpose Room and not by the kindergarten gate area. Remember to keep mov-

ing forward so we can get as many cars as possible into the loop. Additionally, the red curb in front of the school on Torrey Pines is not a pick-up, drop-off area as marked by traffic signs. Not abiding by this could result in a traffic ticket.

Your help keeps the students safe. Please take your time when entering and exiting the parking lot and remember the loop is a NO cell phone use area. Safety is our top priority.

### Give your child the best start to the day - Be on time

Remember, the bell rings to line up at 8:20 am each morning for grades 1-5. Please be sure to drop your children off at school on time. Gates open at 8:00am. Prompt attendance is crucial to maximize student learning. Arriving to school just five minutes late each morning adds up to nearly three full days of missed instruction over the course of the school year! Thank you for your support.



# VISITORS WELCOME! PLEASE SIGN IN AT OFFICE

### MVUSD Visitor/Volunteer Management System

Murrieta Valley Unified is a leader in school safety and we are adding another school safety tool, the web-based Raptor Visitor Management System. Last year two district schools successfully used the Raptor ID system to check-in visitors and parents. This year we are expanding the use of the web-based Raptor ID system, which has been installed at every school in the district. The Raptor Visitor Manage-

ment technology is in place at more than 18,000 schools nationwide and over 800 schools in California.

Starting this week, every parent, visitor, vendor and volunteer that enters a district school will be asked to present their driver's license or state ID. Raptor scans the ID and checks the visitor's name, date of birth and photo for comparison purposes against the National Sex Offender data base. No other personal identifying information is saved. If no match is found, the system will print a sticker id badge with a picture identifying them as an approved visitor.

If the system raises a question about a visitor's background, the school administrator will meet with the visitor.

Upon your initial visit the process will take a couple of minutes, however, on return visits the system has the ability to process the required information much faster. Please remember that you must bring your driver's license or state Identification each time you visit one of our campuses.

We know the safety of your child is as important to you as it is to us so we ask for your patience and cooperation as this new system is implemented at all our schools. ### A Message from the Health Office

### Health Alert-Food Allergies/Sensitivities

We have several students in our school that may have food allergies, food sensitivities or dietary restrictions. Food allergies can trigger reactions that range from very mild to life threatening (anaphylaxis). Generally, an individual must ingest a food allergen to have a reaction, but for some, even being exposed to it or ingesting a very small amount can cause a life threatening reaction. As a result, there are several procedures that will help to prevent exposure and reduce the risk of anaphylaxis and help keep all of our students safe:

- 1. Students should be encouraged to wash their hands upon arrival to the classroom and again before and after lunch. This not only is good for food allergies, but helps reduce disease transmission.
- 2. The classrooms should be peanut/tree nut/food allergy *aware* spaces. Classroom projects or assignments should NOT include the use of peanut butter/nuts or other food items. Any exception to this rule would require pre-approval and prior notification to parents.
- 3. Any food or snack that may be provided/shared must have pre-approval and prior notification must be provided to all parents prior so they can make alternate choices. Additionally, all food items provided should be pre-packaged and food ingredients must be known or labeled. Suggestions for class sharing (birthday parties, etc.) may be providing or donating a book for the classroom or other non-food items.

If your student has a food allergy, please make sure you contact/inform the Health Office. You may want to speak to the School Nurse if the allergy requires medication or other interventions. Students with food allergies may be entitled to accommodations or plans to address their needs. We look forward to working collaboratively with you to provide all of our students with a safe learning environment. We appreciate your care and support of our students and school.

# SEPTEMBER IS ATTENDANCE AWARENESS MONTH



#### DID YOU KNOW?

Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school. • Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read. • Stu-

dents can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks. • Being late to school may lead to poor attendance. • Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up. Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.





#### WHAT IS THE RAIN ELEMENTARY COUNSELING PROGRAM?

The RAIN Elementary School Counseling program is designed to provide students with the academic and social skills they need to be successful in school. RAIN School Counselors teach core counseling lessons in the classrooms on concepts such as improving skills for learning, developing and demonstrating empathy, problem solving, emotion regulation, bully prevention and college and career. Counselors facilitate small groups to support academic and social emotional needs of students. Any student in grades TK-5 may participate in the RAIN program.

Dear Buchanan Families,

Last spring all Buchanan 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders completed their 2017 CAASPP assessments in Language Arts and Math. At this point you should have received individual score reports for your students in both of these areas.



As you look at these reports please note that these results are just one piece of the larger puzzle that is your student's education. Common formative assessments, reading inventories, math inventories, daily class assignments, and teacher observations along with CAASPP results create a more complete picture of each student's academic progress. Even with that we have to consider other factors, like social development, when making decisions regarding all of our young Blazers' education.

Eduardo Briceno in an article about summative assessments like CAASPP wrote this, "Remember, and remind students, that tests don't measure students' potential (which nobody knows, and can always be expanded), but what they have learned so far." With this in mind, help your student maintain a growth mindset, and remind them that their potential is yet to be realized.
