

#### **Student Lunches and Cafeteria Meals**



#### Mix It Up Day—October 31st

What is Mix it Up at lunch??? It's a simple call to action for all grade levels: Take a new seat at lunch time. By taking a risk, students can cross the lines of division in a safe, supported environment, meet new people and help build an inclusive and welcoming school community. Teaching Tolerance, a project of the Southern Poverty Law Center, launched the Mix It Up program in 2002. National Mix It Up at Lunch Day is on October 31st this year. Research shows that Mix It Up programming works. According to a survey of Mix organizers, the program produces powerful results: 97% said students' interactions were positive during Mix It Up at Lunch Day, 95% said Mix It Up at Lunch Day prompted students to interact with people outside their normal social circles, and 83% said the event helped students make new friends. #### Counselor's Corner

#### A Three-Step Plan to Address Cyberbullying with Your Child

Today's children are the first generation to use technology to bully each other. Today's parents are the first who have needed to learn how to address this issue with their children. The following steps are a guide for exploring this topic with your child.

- 1. Have the "cyberbullying" conversation. Now that you know bullying online is a real possibility, initiate a conversation with your child. Bullying can be hard for children to talk about with their parents for many reasons. They might be embarrassed by what is happening, afraid that the bullying will increase if they tell, or think it is their own problem. Cyberbullying can add additional complications. Many students might not interpret the mean and hurtful behavior that happens on their computer or cell phone as bullying. Children may also worry that they will lose access to their technology if they tell their parents about cyberbullying. As you open the subject for discussion, let your child know that it's fine to use phones and computers and to be online with friends, but that you also want him or her to be safe from cyberbullying. Explain that if something hurtful is communicated online, it counts as bullying, and that it is important that you know about it.
- 2. Set cyber safety rules. You set safety rules for your child in the physical world. Do the same in your child's cyberworld. Remind your children that they never really know who is on the other end of cyber communication. It could be the person they think it is, but because they cannot see that person, they should always proceed with caution in their exchanges. With that in mind, two good guidelines are:
- Don't do or say anything online that you wouldn't do or say in person.
- Don't reveal anything that you wouldn't tell a stranger. Specific advice for your child might include: Never share your e-mail password, a photo, or any personal data (such as a physical description, phone number, or address). A bully could use that information to harass you in many ways. Never share too many personal details. Never share your IM account password with anyone, even your best friend. That friend may share it with other people, or the friendship may end and your private messages could suddenly become very public. A cyberbully with your password can sign on, pretend to be you, and behave inappropriately with others to embarrass and humiliate you.
- 3. Know what your children are doing online. Privacy is important, but safety is more important. As a parent, you have a responsibility to know what your children are doing online. Establish rules about your access to your children's cell phones, text history, social networking sites, and other computer accounts that they may use for posting information. If you do discover that your child is being cyberbullied, document it by printing the e-mails or webpages, saving electronic copies, and contacting your child's school.



## A Message from the Health Office



It is common at this time of year to have outbreaks of head lice in the community. The following information can help to prevent the spread of head lice.



Head lice are small insects that are generally found on the scalp, around the ears, and at the back of the neck. The adult louse is about the size of a sesame seed, and can be the color of your hair. Nits (eggs) are smaller and silver in color. Nits stick to the hair shaft and do not easily flake off hair.

Head lice do not transmit disease. Head lice are not a sign of poor hygiene. Lice cannot jump and not fly. Lice may spread from one person to another if there is direct head to head contact, or by sharing of personal items such as combs, brushes, hats, or helmets. Lice usually die within two days without a human host.

The most common symptom of head lice is itching and head scratching, particularly at night. Redness or sores from scratching may also be noticed. If you suspect that your child has head lice, we suggest you contact your health care provider. Safe and effective products to treat head lice are available both over the counter and by a doctor prescription. It is important to follow the directions carefully. In tion, use a fine-tooth comb or special nit comb to help remove the nits. You can also check your child's scalp weekly when the hair is wet to see if there are any new head lice. Wash in hot water all recently worn clothing, hats, used bedding and towels. Personal care items such as combs, brushes and hair clips should be washed in hot water. Toys, such as stuffed animals, can be put in a tightly closed plastic bag for fourteen days or placed in a hot dryer for 30 minutes.

Notify the School Health Office if your child has head lice. The best treatment is prevention.
