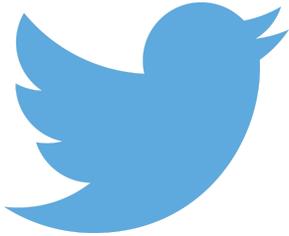
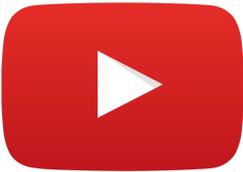


# Stay Connected with Alta!
