Introductions

What is Title I?

- Federal funds provided to school districts
- Intended to close the achievement gaps, specifically for low-income students
- Intended to support effective, research-based educational strategies that close the achievement gap and enable students to meet the state's challenging academic standards
- For schools to qualify, they must have 35% or greater of their student population on free and reduced lunch
- Murrieta allocates Title I at the elementary level only, but a district may allocate to K-12 schools
- Associated rules and requirements; state of transition

- Private School Equitable Services
- Program Improvement: Transportation, Tutoring, Alternative Supports
- School-wide vs. Targeted
- Parent Involvement and Parent Involvement Policies
- Evaluating Program Effectiveness
