OTHER FOOD SALES

The sale of foods during the school day shall be allowed only if all income from the sale, including the sale of approved foods or drinks from vending machines, accrues to the benefit of the school, the school food service program, or the student organization(s) sponsoring the sale. (7 CFR 210.11, 220.12)

Food and beverage sales conducted outside the district's food service program on school campuses during the school day shall comply with applicable nutritional standards specified in 7 CFR 210.11 and 220.12 or with state nutrition standards in Education Code 49431-49431.7 and 5 CCR 15500-15501 and 15575-15578, whichever rule is stricter.

These standards shall apply to all competitive foods and beverages sold from midnight before the school day to one-half hour after the end of the school day. (7 CFR 210.11)

Elementary Schools

The Superintendent or designee shall not permit the sale of foods or beverages by a student organization except when all of the following conditions are met: (5 CCR 15500)

- 1. The student organization may sell one nutritionally compliant food or beverage item per sale.
- 2. The specific nutritious food or beverage item is approved by the Superintendent or designee in accordance with Board policy.
- 3. The sale does not begin until after the close of the regularly scheduled midday food service period.
- 4. The sale during the regular school day is not of food or beverage items prepared on the premises.
- 5. There are no more than four such sales per year per school.
- 6. The food sold is not one sold in the district's food service program at that school during the school day.

Middle Schools and High Schools

In middle schools and high schools, a Board approved student organization may be approved to sell nutritionally compliant food and beverage items during the school day if all of the following conditions are met: (5 CCR 15501)

OTHER FOOD SALES (continued)

- 1. Only one student organization conducts a sale on a given school day.
- 2. The organization sells no more than three types of food or beverage items.
- 3. Up to four days during the school year may be designated on which any number of organizations may conduct the sale of any food or beverage items.
- 4. The specific nutritious food or beverage items are approved by the Superintendent or designee and comply with federal/state regulations.
- 5. Items sold during the regular school day are not prepared on the premises.
- 6. The items sold are not those sold in the district's food service program at that school during that school day.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain records and shall require organizations selling foods and beverages to maintain records, to document compliance with federal nutrition standards for all competitive foods and beverages sold through and outside the district's food services program. At a minimum, these records shall include receipts, nutrition labels, and/or product specifications. (7 CFR 210.11)
